RE: Department Proposed Budget for FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23

Dear Mayor Breed,

In conformance with rules set forth by the Office of the Mayor and the Controller's Office for Department budget submissions, please accept the Office of the District Attorney's proposed 2021-22 and 2022-23 budget request. This budget request contains the necessary resources to sustain the vital work that is carried out by the professionals of this Office. This budget submission does not contain the requested 7.5% target reduction in General Fund resources in the budget year nor does it contain a reduction in the subsequent year. Our budget submission simply requests that our office receive the minimum level of funding needed to perform our basic responsibilities, bringing us to the level of staffing we had when I assumed office.

As you know, my office has faced significant challenges during the current fiscal year. We began my first year in office by agreeing to significant cuts to help the City close its budget deficit; and even for the current approved budget, our office has not been allowed to fill many key vacancies within our attorney, investigator and victim advocate ranks.

Under our current budget, SFDA has endured the lowest staffing level it has had in the last four years, which has severely impacted our staff and our ability to serve the residents of the City and County of San Francisco. Complying with your office's budget instructions would be catastrophic for the work of our office. I would have to lay off the equivalent of 21 mid-career prosecutors just to meet the 7.5% target reduction and an additional 7 mid-career prosecutors to meet the 2.5% contingency. Reductions of this magnitude would create severe gaps in services to the victims of crime in this County and in the administration of justice overall.

Lastly, given our current level of staffing and the fact that we face key vacancies in our attorney, investigator and victim services ranks, I must once again respectfully request that you allow my office to fill key vacant positions that are already funded within our current budget.

SAN FRANCISCO DISTRICT ATTORNEY BUDGET REQUEST NARRATIVE FOR FY 2021-22 & 2022-23

BUDGET REQUESTS NARRATIVES

I. Independent Investigations Bureau - \$627,120

In its 5th year of funding, the Independent Investigations Bureau (IIB) is firmly in place as the entity investigating Officer Involved Shootings and other peace officer misconduct. The District Attorney's Office has signed an MOU with SFPD to be the lead agency responding to and investigating these matters. Since its inception, the IIB funding level has remained at \$2.7 million dollars. During this time, the City has agreed to ongoing cost of living adjustments and other negotiated pay premiums that are not accounted for within the original funding level. These escalating costs in addition to annual step adjustments have made it impossible for the Department to remain fully staffed in this Bureau. Over the last few years, the Department has had to leave multiple positions vacant for extended periods of time to stay within budgeted level. This comes at a critical time as just within the last year, the Department has filed 3 officer use of force cases which will be intensely litigated, potentially for many years to come. Additionally, the 24/7, 365 nature of this Bureau continues to drive the need for full staffing to appropriately cover the ongoing on call structure of this assignment over the course of the year. The Department is requesting to adjust the funded level of IIB to be commensurate with the funding required to staff the 14-person unit. The Department is requesting \$627,120 to fully fund IIB.

II. Fentanyl Task Force - \$2,287,359

The District Attorney's Office proposes the establishment of a first of its kind prosecutor led Fentanyl Taskforce to disrupt drug sales and trafficking in neighborhoods that are most affected by the fentanyl crisis, including SOMA, Mission and the Tenderloin. The proposed SFDA Fentanyl Taskforce will prioritize prosecution of individuals at the mid and upper levels of sales networks who are responsible for criminal operations.

The Taskforce is a multi-disciplinary model driven by data, behavioral science, and a health first approach. Research shows that singularly focused street level enforcement strategies do not meet ultimate crime reduction objectives and disproportionately impact people of color. The Taskforce will work collaboratively with system partners to implement effective social and behavioral health responses for individuals who are engaged in street-level drug sales for subsistence purposes.

The Taskforce is a critical step toward dismantling the structures set up by half a century of harm established through the failed war on drugs, disrupting the complex mid and high-level networks distributing and selling drugs, and meeting the community call for housing, treatment on demand and real solutions that address the social conditions associated with drug markets. The Taskforce is a strategic approach to hold people and systems accountable, end exploitation, and direct people toward housing and treatment to make San Francisco safe and livable for everyone.

Prosecution & Policy

Under the supervision of a managing attorney six experienced prosecutors will develop impactful prosecutorial, policy and legislative strategies that attack drug sales at its root.

Investigation

Two DA Investigators will build cases from the ground up to uncover supply-side criminal enterprises. A financial crimes investigator will bolster those investigations by addressing illicit business enterprises and money laundering. DA Investigators will work hand in hand with the prosecuting attorney particularly as new investigative areas emerge after a case has been charged.

Sentencing Planning

Two Sentencing Planners with expertise and detailed knowledge of programs and services available in San Francisco will develop individualized sentences that address the needs and risks of justice-involved individuals involved in drug sales to reduce reoffending and increase individual accountability.

Analysis

The Taskforce will perform data-driven investigations, including hotspot analysis, cataloguing and tracking activities associated with drug trafficking and conducting link analysis to document criminal networks.

Transparency and Accountability

The SFDA is committed to transparency and accountability throughout the implementation of the Fentanyl Taskforce. The District Attorney Chairs the <u>San Francisco Sentencing Commission</u> where reports on the activities of the Taskforce will be a standing agenda item allowing for collaboration and public comment.

This request is to fund 6 8177 Trial Attorneys, 2 8550 DA Investigators, and 2 8133 Victim Witness Investigator III/Sentence Planners at a total cost of \$2,287,359.

III. Crime Victim Hotline - \$650,000

Currently, the San Francisco hotlines available for victims of crime are for certain crime types, including domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse. While these hotlines provide crime-specific resources, there are many crime victims who do not have access to a 24/7 service to help them navigate criminal, legal and social services available to victims of violent crime in San Francisco. Additionally, while the San Francisco District Attorney's Office Victim Services Division can provide resources to all victims of violent crime, the agency is not 24/7 and many victims do not feel comfortable accessing services through a division of a prosecutor's office. The call takers for San Francisco's 311 service can provide basic information about city services; however, a trained hotline staff that specializes in serving victims of crime using trauma-informed services

would better meet the needs of San Franciscans. The estimated cost for this project is \$650,00 in the first year to allow for community-based bidders to present proposals in response to an RFP.

IV. Two Credible Messengers - \$198,842

In order to build stronger relationships with community members who are victims of violence, but who do not have enough trust to seek services through the SFDA Victim Services Division, we propose hiring two Credible Messengers. Credible Messengers are members of the community who were impacted themselves by the justice system, have strong ties to the community, and who can act as a liaison with community members. Credible Messengers will help ensure that victims of crime, especially those who have negative justice experiences themselves, can access the resources available to them as victims of crime. The goal of the Credible Messengers will be to provide comprehensive resources, trauma-informed warm-handoffs to victim agencies, and to help prevent victims of crime from crossing over and committing crime. The four neighborhoods identified for this project: the Bayview, Visitation Valley, Mission and Excelsior have long histories of gang violence, non-gang related violence and ongoing victimization. Residents of the four neighborhoods have historically underreported crimes as a result of deep-seated distrust and disconnect between the community and the criminal justice system. Moreover, lack of awareness and misinformation about the services available through the SFDA's Victim Services Division prevents and deters victims from seeking help. For the past five years, the SFDA Victim Services Division has employed two specialized victim advocates to work with victims of crime in these communities. While these advocates can build strong relationships with identified victims, they do not have the bandwidth to conduct outreach and build relationships with community members who are not yet willing to pursue services through the DA's office. This request is to fund two 8129 Victim Witness Investigator I in the amount of \$198,842.

V. Two Clinical Social Workers for Victim Services - \$223,312

The Victim Services Division of the San Francisco District Attorney's Office serves approximately 8,000 victims of crime annually. Currently, our Division employs 26 Victim Advocates, with an average of 307 new cases assigned to each Victim Advocate each year. These new cases are in addition to the cases that carry over from years prior. While Victim Advocates provide quality advocacy services to all victims of crime, due to their high caseloads they are unable to provide intensive case management services to victims who have higher or more intensive needs. Victim of crime clients often present with a multitude of high care needs including but not limited to, housing instability or homelessness, histories of repeated victimization, mental health issues, substance abuse issues, and prior justice involvement. These higher need victims with ongoing exposure to community violence often require a higher level of care than victims with none or one of these exposures or challenges. To adequately serve these clients, this request seeks to hire two Clinical Social Workers to serve as Intensive Care Victim Advocates. These advocates would provide intensive case management to victims who are identified as having higher or more

intensive needs based on a weighted intake assessment. Intensive Care Victim Advocates would develop more thorough case plans with victims and provide more direct contact and follow-up with victims than traditional victim advocates. The goal of these advocates would be to provide increased wraparound services and ensure that the victims are assisted with counseling services, supportive or transitional housing, in-depth explanations of the criminal justice system, and collaboration with other community providers. This request is to fund two 8131 Victim Witness Investigator II in the amount of \$223,312.

VI. Two Property Crime Advocates - \$198,842

The Victim Services Division is currently only staffed to serve victims of violent crime, yet there are tens of thousands of victims of property crime each year in San Francisco. Most of the State funding that supports victims of crime stipulate the funding is exclusively for victims of violent crime. Due to these funding restrictions the Department has been unable to appropriately serve victims of property crime cases. In 2020, there were approximately 40,000 property crimes reported to SFPD¹. Central, Mission, and Northern stations had the highest reported property crimes in the City. This request is to fund two 8129 Victim Witness I positions dedicated to managing a property crime caseload. These positions would be responsible for the following:

- 1. Contact all victims of property crime with 24 hours of having the case presented to SFDA.
- 2. Collect any restitution documents for their loss.
- 3. Help with resources and referrals (e.g. D5 window project, assistance with insurance claims & documentation).
- 4. Work with businesses that are affected by property crimes (prevention, restitution, court process).

VII. Emergency Victim Fund - \$100,000

The California Victim Compensation Board (VCB), State agency primarily responsible for supporting financial losses of victims of violent crime, does not cover all expenses associated with crime victimization. In order to access these funds, the application process for state victim compensation funds requires a waiting period. Once cases are eligible for review, not all resources needed by victims after emergencies are allowable under the guidelines of the state. Claims are denied or victims do not qualify based on the nature, facts, lack of information, or specific reporting on each case. This extended process often does not provide the necessary immediate resources to address the emergency needs of crime victims. Often, in the wake of an emergency, victims of crime require immediate financial assistance to restore the victims' health and safety, and assist them on the road to recovery. These funding gaps leave many victims of crime without

the resources necessary to heal and rebuild their lives. In the absence of insurance or other coverage, such victims are left to absorb the costs of their own victimization.

In order to address these additional needs and ensure individualized care, the Office of the San Francisco District Attorney has managed a supplemental fund to provide emergency aid (DA-Relo) which currenlty funded at \$125,000 a year. With the growing number of victims in need of financial resources, particulary in unsolved cases and due to financial hardships caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, increases in certain categories of property crimes and more vulnerable children and families, we are requesting additional funds in the amount of \$100,000.

VIII. Advanced Legal Support - \$553,227

In 2020, the San Francisco District Attorney's Office received over 9,000 criminal case referrals. In the busiest units it is not unusual for an Assistant District Attorney to carry a caseload of over 200 cases, both new and ongoing cases, leading to delays in case processing, employee turnover and burnout. With the onset of the pandemic our support staff have played a critical role in maintaining the ongoing operations of the Department. In a very short time our office, went from exclusively paper-based systems to a much greater reliance on digitized records. Compounding this new and complex way of work is the continuous reliance on digitized evidence from body worn cameras, store front cameras, camera phones and many more media-based forms of evidence. Processing and preparing evidence for Court has become an extensively complex and exhaustive process that the Department is not adequately resourced to handle.

Highly skilled Legal Assistants can play a critical role in preparing cases for resolution either diversion, settlement, or trial at a much lower cost than hiring additional attorneys. To assist with this overwhelming caseload, we are proposing that hiring skilled Legal Assistants is a cost-effective solution to assist attorneys in high volume units, thereby expediting the cause of justice, reducing burnout and improving retention of experienced personnel.

We are proposing advanced legal support, provided by 8173 Legal Assistants, as a proven, cost-effective solution to assist with this high volume of cases. Legal Assistants have the paraprofessional skillset to draft motions, perform legal research and writing, prepare statements of fact, draft legal correspondence and provide advanced legal support for all stages of litigation. We propose deploying 5 Legal Assistants at a cost of \$553,227 in the critically impacted units where support with case work is needed the most.

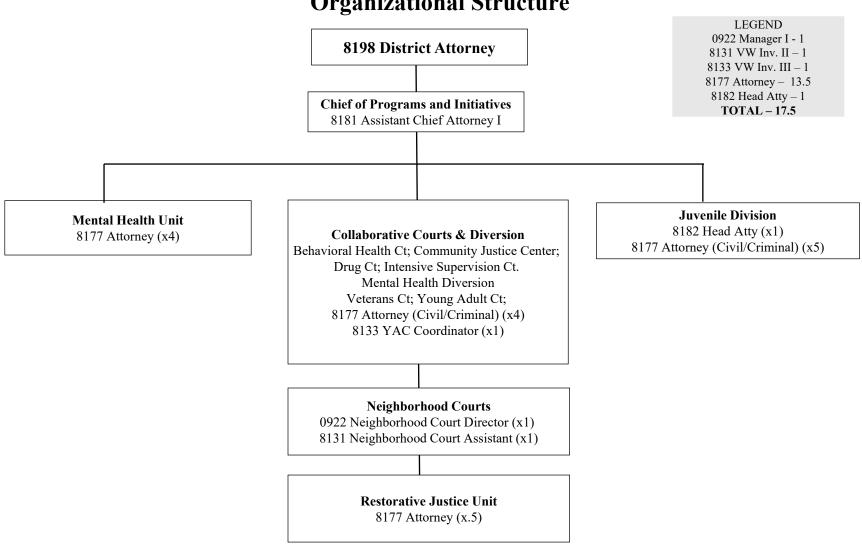

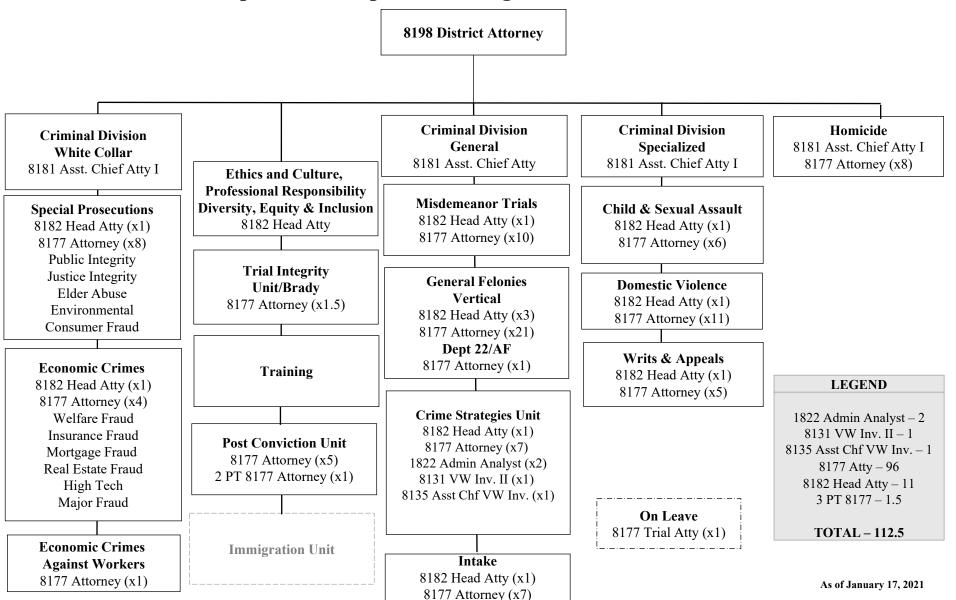




San Francisco District Attorney Programs and Initiatives Organizational Structure
