#### Task Force (TF) Mapping Procedures

#### **Principles:**

- The TF will provide Q2 with specific instructions for a starting point for the first maps to be presented to the Task Force on 3-2-22 the first mapping meeting of the TF.
- Mapping requests and changes will be initiated by the TF and they will work with Q2 who will draw the next requested iterative map.
- Discussions will be focused on Communities of Interest, Neighborhoods, District Boundaries, Census
   Data and compliance with The Voting Rights Act.
- Allow Task Force to explore multiple paths or maps.
- Offer clear forward direction and clarity for the mapping process status at the end of each meeting.

#### Communication

Liaisons on process, clarification or info/questions between TF and Q2 for mapping will be Members Matt Castillon and Chasel Lee. Members Castillon and Chasel Lee will be in charge of coordinating the process and keeping a written log of what feedback or input is incorporated in each map. This feedback should be reflected in the public record and in the Final Report.

#### **Task-Force Centralized Mapping for Follow Up Maps**

TF members will initiate all requests for maps or mapping changes.

After the members have shared their comments there will be a recommendation to advance one of the prior maps with specific changes.

Where possible the TF will attempt to advance the next stage of the mapping process off a chosen specific and hopefully single map. If needed multiple map will be advanced but the goal will be to always advance off of one specific map.

As the new map is selected the TF will ask Q2 to come back with that map as the basis with 2 or 3 new/different versions on the next iteration.

After the TF has provided their direction to Q2 there will be public comment.

The members may again discuss the maps and any changes they would like to see if any.

The map may then be advanced without further changes or with changes recommended and approved by the TF. If consensus has been reached then the mapping request will be advanced to Q2. If there is no consensus, a formal vote may be taken.

This will be the process the TF will follow at each mapping meeting until the final map is selected on or before April 14<sup>th</sup>.

Groups and the public may submit their maps to the TF through the public website, and TF members may pick parts or all of a map to incorporate into their mapping requests. In order to maintain fairness, all outside feedback will be evaluated independently and no outside individual will be given preferential treatment over any other member of the public.

• Specifically, non-TF generated maps are a form of public comment, and no publicly generated maps will be directly presented to a member of the TF by an interest group or non-task force member.

#### **Sample Mapping Advancement and Naming Sequence:**

- -Mapping Day 1 (3-2-22): TF provides parameters to Q2 to create Map 1 A
  - -3-9-22 Q2 provides Map 1 A to the TF for discussion on 3-14-22
- -Mapping Day 2 (3-14-22):
  - TF provides new mapping instructions of boundary changes to Map 1 A which will then be returned named Maps 2 A and 2 B.
- -Mapping Day 3 (3-23-22): Q2 will return next mapping day with changes requested by TF Maps 2 A & 2 B
  - TF motions through consensus or vote to move one of the maps let's say Map 2 B forward
  - TF provides new mapping instructions of boundary changes to Map 2 B which will then be returned, if there are three, named Maps 3 A, 3 B and perhaps a 3 C.
  - \*From here on in mapping days will be numbered but not dated as dates may be added as we go along.
- -Mapping Day 4: Q2 will return next mapping day with changes requested by TF Maps 3 A, 3 B, & 3 C
  - TF motions through consensus or vote to move let's say Map 3 C forward
  - TF provides new mapping instructions of boundary changes to Map 3 C which will then be returned, if there are two, named Maps 4 A & 4 B.
- -Mapping Day 5: Q2 will return next mapping day with changes requested by TF Maps 4 A & 4 B
  - TF motions through consensus or vote to move map let's say 4 A forward.
  - TF provides new mapping instructions of boundary changes to Map 4 A which will then be returned, if there are two, named Maps 5 A & 5 B.

The mapping continues as noted above until a final map is voted on.

#### **Live Line Drawing**

Line drawing is conducted during public sessions at officially agendized task force meetings. Line drawing may also occur at any other designated mapping meetings if the TF decided to do so. Combination of mapping and line drawing meetings may occur at the discretion of the TF.

Two specific dates, because of Q2 turn around requirements have been designated as line drawing days. They are 3-26-22 and 4-9-22.

Consultants (Q2) will be present with a mapper and digital maps at the ready.

The Task Force can start with existing lines, or with someone's proposed new lines, or with a blank map. In some cases the task force may work up "visualizations," which may be rough-sketch districts, and proceed from there.

The Chair or designee will focus on a particular area and then begin taking input from other Task Force members about particular lines.

TF members are free to give whatever reasons they think germane to their proposals, whether it were public input, or balancing populations, or known neighborhood boundaries.

#### 1. Only one change could be considered at a time (though mappers could undo past changes as needed).

Line mapping will be done by consensus.

It's all iterative: after an area is finished (an area could be a district, multiple districts or any area of San Francisco) then public input would come in, and the TF might also do further research, and then revisit that area and make changes

Maps 2 A and 2 B; March 18, 2022


Maps 2 A and 2 B were drawn to adhere to the following Task Force direction. This direction was based off changes the Task Force requested be made to Map 1 A:

- Keep Japantown with Western Addition
- Keep Duboce Triangle, Corona Heights, and Buena Vista Park with Castro
- Keep Visitacion Valley, including Sunnydale, in District 10
- Move the border between Districts 8 and 9 to Guerrero
- Keep Potrero Hill unified in one district
- Keep the OMI Neighborhoods in District 11
- Unify South Beach
- Drawing districts to +/-5% deviation is acceptable to respect the boundaries of recognized neighborhoods The boundaries of publicly submitted Communities of Interest were respected when possible in the creation of both maps.

With the exception of including Sunnydale with district 10A, each of these goals outlined by the Task Force is accomplished in Map 2 A to the extent possible given discrepancies between census geography and neighborhood boundaries.


Map 2 B is based on Map 2 A as a starting point. Sunnydale is included in district 10B, and so the northern border of that district moved south to accommodate the added population. As a result, the Tenderloin is included with district 3B to compensate for the population change in district 6B. The Financial District was added to district 6B to help balance between districts 3B and 6B and to avoid creating further large-scale impacts on the map that would contradict the direction listed above. All of the direction outlined above is accomplished in Map 2 B to the extent possible given discrepancies between census geography and neighborhood boundaries.

Map 2 A; March 18, 2022





## Introduction: What is Redistricting?

- ➤ San Francisco has 11 supervisorial districts, used to elect the Board of Supervisors.
- Redistricting is the process of adjusting the existing supervisorial district boundaries.
- ➤ Redistricting happens every ten years, after the release of the decennial Census data used to balance the populations of the supervisorial districts.
- Redistricting provides the opportunity to bring the existing districts into compliance with all redistricting criteria.

## What are the criteria for redistricting?

- Compliance with US and CA Constitution (equal population)
- Compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act (VRA)
- Preservation of recognized neighborhoods
- Preservation of communities of interest (Cols)
- Contiguity
- Compactness



## Constitution and the Voting Rights Act

- ➤ U.S. Constitution requires that districts be of roughly equal population.
  - ➤ Population variations between districts should be limited to ±1% of the mean (±795 people) unless additional variations, limited to 5% of the mean (±3,977 people), are necessary to prevent dividing or diluting the voting power of minorities and/or to keep recognized neighborhoods intact.
- ➤ District map must comply with the Voting Rights Act (VRA) to protect the voting power of racial and language minorities.



## Recognized Neighborhoods and Communities of Interest

- Recognized neighborhoods are generally based on data and geography collected from official sources like the Planning Department. Neighborhood data may be submitted by members of the public as well. Neighborhoods may vary in size and definition depending on who is defining them.
- Communities of interest (Cols) are generally described as a population of residents that share common interests (such as social, economic, or cultural interests) that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation.
- Cols are defined by those familiar with the community.
  - Law does not limit the kinds of interests that may bind a community.
  - It is up to those who live in or work with a community to identify and establish the interests that unite it.
  - Interests need not be limited to the current situation but can also include common goals.
- Communities of Interest do NOT include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.



### **Examples of Common Interests**

#### **Economic interests:**

Current situation: common employment or economic opportunities (or lack thereof).

Goals: expanding opportunities, development, job creation, etc.

#### Social interests:

Current: schools, culture, transportation, parks, housing

Goals: improving recreational opportunities or public safety, preserving historic resources, etc.

#### Cultural interests:

Current: holidays, cultural businesses

Goals: cultural meeting centers, official recognition through cultural districts



## Contiguity, Compactness & Census Geography

- ➤ Districts should be <u>contiguous</u>
  - All parts of a district must be adjacent to another part of the district
  - Areas separated by water and not connected by a bridge, tunnel, or regular ferry service are not contiguous
- ➤ Districts should be compact
  - Does not bypass nearby areas of population in favor of more distant populations
- > District boundaries must generally follow census blocks

- All publicly submitted maps and narratives will be considered public comment. No public comment/map will be given preferential treatment over any other comment/map from the public.
- The Task Force will consider all submissions to assist in its decisionmaking but will not advance or vote on any map submitted by the public.
- Through an iterative mapping process, the Task Force will direct its consultant Q2 Data and Research to create the draft maps and ultimately the official final map.

#### Dear Chair Townsend and Task Force members:

Please see attached my third matrix showing the concentration of foreign-born registered voters by neighborhood and by precinct for District 11. The previous two matrices were for Districts 5 and 6.

The matrix also includes eight precincts adjacent to District 11 which have been proposed by different members of the public to be added to the current district.

Unlike the previous matrices, there were only six foreign-born nationalities greater than 1% of the registered voters of the district, which included Chinese (15.88%), Filipino (7.69%), Salvadoran (2.81%), Vietnamese (2.03%), Mexican (1.90%), and Nicaraguan (1.44%) for a total of 31.75% of the district's registered voters. Another 1.35% of the registered voters in the district are from other Asian nationalities, 2.27% from Hispanic nationalities, and 2.16% from non Hispanic and Asian countries.

The 26.95% of the registered voters of the district who are foreign-born Asians and 8.42% foreign-born Hispanics, compare to the CVAP for District 11 of 55.98% for Asians and 22.06% for Hispanics and suggest that the majority of the Citizens Voting Age Population of the district are a combination of American-born Asians and Hispanics who are registered to vote, plus naturalized Asians and Hispanics who are not currently registered to vote.

The data suggest that the proposed addition of the), St. Mary's Park (precinct 7943), and the western portion of the Portola district (precinct 7948) to District 11 on the premise of joining the Filipinos adjacent to District 11 to the Filipino community in District 11 is misguided, and will actually result in the dilution of Filipinos, Chinese, and Vietnamese

in the district.

According to the latest data from the Master Voter File as of 3/17/22, Filipino foreign-born registered voters in precincts 7874, 7943, and 7948 are respectively 4.72%, 5.29%, and 5.94% of the registered voters in those precincts compared to 7.69% currently in District 11; Chinese foreign-born registered voters in the three precincts, respectively, are 2.05%, 2.98%, and 11.88% of the registered voters in those precincts compared to 15.88%, currently in District 11; and Vietnamese foreign-born registered voters in the three precincts, respectively, are 0.82%, 0.99%, and 1.71% in those precincts compared to 2.03%. currently in District 11.

St. Mary's Park and precinct 7874 should remain in their current districts or be assigned either both to District 8 or District 9, while Precinct 7948 should remain with the rest of the Portola District either in District 9 as proposed by the Coalition for San Francisco Neighborhoods' and West of Twin Peaks Central Council's Incremental/Minimal Change redistricting plan or in District 10 under the Chinese American Democratic Club's redistricting proposal. They most definitely should not be added to District 11 as proposed by the Community Unity redistricting plan.

I would suggest from 2nd St, you continue to BRYANT ST heading toward the bay, cross The Embarcadero into the water between Pier 28 and 30/32 including Pier 26 and 28. Population-wise, this looks like it would add the Clocktower Building and Portside I within District 3A. Just for example, I noticed that Portside... which consists of Portside I, (38 Bryant St), and Portside II, (403 Main St) are currently divided in half! My name is Prodan Statev and I live and work in East Cut. I've lived here for 4 years and plan to start my own company with an office in East Cut.

I am asking that you keep the District 6 area South of Market, including the East Cut, Mission Bay, South Beach and Treasure Island together. We are truly communities of interest with many commonalities. Task Force Map 2B (D6B) most closely aligns with our goals and we thank you for hearing our needs and mapping to serve them. However, there is one section of Mission Bay which has been aligned with District 10 (the Chase Center). We respectively request these Mission Bay parcels 29-32, with street boundaries of 3rd Street, 16th Street, Warriors Way and Terry Francois Blvd, be realigned back to District 6 for the following reasons:

A. These parcels are an integral part of the Mission Bay Redevelopment Plan.

B. The Warriors as the primary owner of these parcels pay into the Community Facilitie Districts (CFD) (also known as Mello-Roos Districts) which assess a special tax lien against taxable property within a district to fund capital projects and/or ongoing operations and maintenance costs in Mission Bay.

C. They also make significant contributions into the Mission Bay Transportation Improvement Fund which funds transportation, security, and cleanliness resources to mitigate the impacts of all events at the Chase Center in Mission Bay and other surrounding communities. In addition, there is funding provided to mitigate the impacts when there are events at both Chase Center and Oracle Park (another District 6 event center).

Map 2A (D6A), however, severs the Communities of Interest we have collectively spent the last decade-plus building while significantly addressing the City's housing needs. Not only does it undermine the community-building of our Emerging Neighborhoods, but it runs counter to the health and safety of our area by making it impossible to address the transportation-based air quality degradation the City identified in its 2020 Community Risk Assessment in a unified, district-wide manner.

We have done the work of building housing for all San Francisco. Don't diminish our ability to build the community—and ensure its health and safety--as well.

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# Dear Chair Townsend and Task Force members:

Please see attached my third matrix showing the concentration of foreign-born registered voters by neighborhood and by precinct for District 11. The previous two matrices were for Districts 5 and 6.

The matrix also includes eight precincts adjacent to District 11 which have been proposed by different members of the public to be added to the current district.

Unlike the previous matrices, there were only six foreign-born nationalities greater than 1% of the registered voters of the district, which included Chinese (15.88%), Filipino (7.69%), Salvadoran (2.81%), Vietnamese (2.03%), Mexican (1.90%), and Nicaraguan (1.44%) for a total of 31.75% of the district's registered voters. Another 1.35% of the registered voters in the district are from other Asian nationalities, 2.27% from Hispanic nationalities, and 2.16% from non Hispanic and Asian countries.

The 26.95% of the registered voters of the district who are foreign-born Asians and 8.42% foreign-born Hispanics, compare to the CVAP for District 11 of 55.98% for Asians and 22.06% for Hispanics and

suggest that the majority of the Citizens Voting Age Population of the district are a combination of Americanborn Asians and Hispanics who are registered to vote, plus naturalized Asians and Hispanics who are not currently registered to vote.

The data suggest that the proposed addition of the), St. Mary's Park (precinct 7943), and the western portion of the Portola district (precinct 7948) to District 11 on the premise of joining the Filipinos adjacent to District 11 to the Filipino community in District 11 is misguided, and will actually result in the dilution of Filipinos, Chinese, and Vietnamese in the district.

According to the latest data from the Master Voter File as of 3/17/22, Filipino foreign-born registered voters in precincts 7874, 7943, and 7948 are respectively 4.72%, 5.29%, and 5.94% of the registered voters in those precincts compared to 7.69% currently in District 11; Chinese foreign-born registered voters in the three precincts, respectively, are 2.05%, 2.98%, and 11.88% of the registered voters in those precincts compared to 15.88%, currently in District 11; and Vietnamese foreign-born registered voters in the three precincts, respectively, are 0.82%, 0.99%, and 1.71% in those precincts compared to 2.03%. currently in District 11.

St. Mary's Park and precinct 7874 should remain in their current districts or be assigned either both to District 8 or District 9, while Precinct 7948 should remain with the rest of the Portola District either in District 9 as proposed by the Coalition for San Francisco Neighborhoods' and West of Twin Peaks Central Council's Incremental/Minimal Change redistricting plan or in District 10 under the Chinese American Democratic Club's redistricting proposal. They most definitely should not be added to District 11 as proposed by the Community Unity redistricting plan.

## Dear Members of the Redistricting Task Force:

As a Community of Interest, the priority of the Board of Directors of the Inner Sunset Merchants Association (ISMA) is to keep the merchant corridor intact and to not let it be divided.

### ISMA & Commercial Corridor Boundaries

ISMA is composed of representatives from retail, professional services, restaurants, nonprofits and other businesses in the Inner Sunset Neighborhood Commercial District. ISMA has been in existence since 1928. The Inner Sunset is defined by the following boundaries: from Arguello Blvd. west to 19th Avenue, and from Fulton Street south to Moraga Street.

The Inner Sunset merchant corridor itself is primarily contained within District 5, namely Arguello to 17th Avenue and between Lincoln and Kirkham, with a small segment in District 4 from 17th-19th Avenues between Lincoln and Kirkham. There are several other pockets of commercial activity within ISMA'S scope and within District 5 that would otherwise have no representation by a merchant association, namely: the businesses in Millberry Union at UCSF Parnassus; the shops along Hugo Street @ 3rd Avenue; and the shops at the intersection of 6th & Parnassus. The focal intersection of the Inner Sunset is 9th Avenue & Irving Street.

## **Position as a Community of Interest**

Separating the Inner Sunset commercial corridor across more than one Supervisor's purview would cause disruption in communication and activation efforts in support of the small business community.

If division of the commercial district is the only option, ISMA strongly opposes using 9th Avenue as a dividing line. Characteristics of 9th Avenue would add to the challenge of working across two districts, including: Muni (N-Judah and busses) runs on 9th Avenue; 9th Avenue is a pedestrian and vehicle entrance to Golden Gate; the intersection of 9th Avenue & Irving is a prominent small business commercial area and could create imbalance for across-the-street businesses; and the community regularly hosts closed-street events at 9th & Irving intersection. Additionally, the Inner Sunset has long had a connection to Golden Gate Park in terms of visitors moving between park attractions and the commercial district.

On behalf of ISMA, we appreciate the Task Force's efforts and consideration.

First, as an African American citizen and voting member of my community, I would like to state that I am also a Building Tenant Organizer of the Vincent Hotel which houses 98 individuals, many of which are either African American or of Asian descent. I have resided in the Tenderloin for several years and I am active in my community and believe the priorities of the Tenderloin are much more aligned with that of the residents of Chinatown and as such we share a common interest and goal in many aspects. I would like to submit to the Redistricting Task Force Central City SRO Collaborative proposed outline for district 3 and 6, exemplifying our position to add the Tenderloin into District 3.

The Central City S.R.O. Collaborative was established in 2001 to organize tenants of Single-Room Occupancy hotels in the Tenderloin. In the last 20 years, CCSRO has fought to preserve SRO hotels, which house the most vulnerable population in the city. They have also bridged a connection to SRO residents to advocate for better living conditions in private SRO hotels in the Tenderloin.

SRO hotels have a historic upbringing in San Francisco, following the devastating earthquake of 1906, SROs were built to house numerous San Franciscans who lost their homes. Over the years, SROs have seen many tenants from a varying background, like seasonal workers or sailors who would not spend much of the year at home.

Today, SROs house some of the City's most vulnerable populations like the elderly, recently immigrated individuals looking for a place to stay, families and individuals who, at some point, were experiencing homelessness. Like the Tenderloin, Chinatown is the home of many SRO hotels and small overcrowded apartments. While many districts in San Francisco have SROs, the Tenderloin and Chinatown is home to the majority of SROs in San Francisco. As a result, this community of interest between the Tenderloin and Chinatown are densely packed districts where residents must live in close quarters with one another.

The dense urban district creates a series of complications for the two neighborhoods, like a serious lack of open space for the residents. These enclosed urban spaces are susceptible to speeding vehicles, creating a serious concern for pedestrian safety for the residents. The Tenderloin and Chinatown are home to people who must rely solely on walking and public transportation to be mobile but must walk in dangerous streets.

SRO residents and the many families in the two neighborhoods have many needs yet to be properly addressed. Our hope is to unify and empower the vulnerable populations and create a strong bond between the community of interest in Chinatown and the Tenderloin. These communities have long championed the conservation of hotels as they are essential to protecting one of the last bastions of available affordable housing in the city. To ensure the protection of SROs, and the most vulnerable in the city, we at CCSRO ask that the redistricting task force unify this community of interest by moving the Tenderloin into district 3.







P.S. In closing I would like to add, that at any given time up until 2018, there was 4 generations of my family residing within the City of San Francisco, I am the only person to remain. I have been unsuccessful at convincing my children to return to this area simply because they have seen vey little being done to address the concerns of any given neighborhood, including the Tenderloin and Chinatown. The time is upon us to make the right decision that will allow the residents most impacted by redistricting and their concerns to be heard.

## Redistricting Task Force,

We, the D3 North Beach Tenants Committee, have looked at the following proposed redistricting maps: Task Force Maps 2A and 3A, the D3 United Neighborhoods and the Community Unity map.

We cannot support these current versions because they split what has traditionally been North Beach in half. We need to keep our historical, geographical neighborhood community whole.

We now have shared resources to meet our D3 needs-hard sought services around language access in assisting seniors, families, childcare, medical services for low-income residents, safe sidewalks and extended time for crossing busy streets like Bay to accommodate all ages, We want this community and our Chinatown community to remain whole. Many of the older Italians today still speak their dialect (largely 4 different dialects) with limited English and are still grouped together in different locations within D3 and although I cannot distinguish between Cantonese, Mandarin, Toisanese, Shanghainese, I have been told that this is often the case for our Chinese neighbors-shared language, shared housing location when one has a choice. I do know that the suggestion of cutting off one part -the Mason to Vallejo section of the "community unity" map- means cutting out many of these above seniors & families.

You and others may call this Russian Hill, but those who live here will tell you this is North Beach, as the historical line was once drawn at Hyde Street. Many of them, retired working class, have been living here for 60 yrs, have a shared history and utilize services in both North Beach & Chinatown. Many of our shared community services are at least partially funded by The City, so what happens to them if district boundary changes bring them into D2?

For example, last year, the NB Merchants Association, Norman Fong, CCDC & I met with D3 legislative aide Angulo to work on funding in the City budget for The Noodle Fest, last done in 2011, to support our Chinese neighbors facing horrible hate-crimes and the merchants, in reviving this unifying event. This involves ALL of us in the current D3 boundaries.

We also had the first ever Italian-Chinese Poetry protest at Washington Square to support Diego De Leo-100 neighbors showed up. Shared displacement, shared history, shared struggle to hold on to what we have. One of our major goals right now is to get truly affordable housing built in the very few spaces we have left in D3, because we need to house our workers, ie.the restaurant workers in both Chinatown & North Beach, and try to bring back all the workers who were forced out w/ evictions and now travel from Antioch to return to their long time jobs from the Wharf and Chinatown. This is our goal, this is why we fought a hotel going up on Columbus & Bay, why we fought for housing to meet our community needs, not the luxury condo projects that are at Planning's door today.

For these reasons, I implore you not to diminish who we are. If we need to stretch our D3 boundary to include part of D6, one suggestion is to expand to Turk. We welcome an area that fits along our boundary which may share some of our history as immigrants & geographic relocation, as well as our goals to preserve our housing stock & build truly affordable housing for our retired workforce and our working class families.

Dear Redistricting Committee,

I am a resident of Potrero Hill, on Kansas Street between 19th and 20th. The draft redistricting map cuts off a small portion of Kansas Street in the middle of Potrero Hill and groups it with the Mission. This would result in my neighbors across the street having different supervisor, and would make it literally impossible for us to collaborate on street safety issues and other neighborhood concerns. We are separated from the balance of the Mission District by the freeway and have no particular connection to most of that district, and I cannot imagine that the supervisor representing that district will pay any attention to a few isolated blocks across the freeway. We would effectively be disenfranchised. Instead of including the bizarre eastward divot shown in the map below, the district boundary should simply follow Potrero Avenue north consistently, or as a fallback, at least follow the curve of the freeway, which is a natural boundary of sorts, consistent with the neighborhood.

Adding back the area from Potrero Avenue to Kansas, 17th to 22nd, results in only adding 1.9% more population to the district. Further, adding Showplace Square from Potrero Avenue to the current District 10 boundaries would continue to result in a district within the 5% population deviation allowed under law to keep recognized neighborhoods and communities of interest together in a single district.

Please address this bizarre anomaly in future versions of the map, and do not cut off our small area from the rest of our neighborhood!

Thank you for all your hard work on rebalancing the districts. Last night, I found it fascinating to listen to a few hours of the public comment and learn so much San Francisco history, particularly for District 11.

I'm writing to you as a resident of Lakeside since 2001, also representing the nonprofit resident organization and business council, "Friends of Lakeside Village".

My question and comment relate to Lakeside One (between Sloat-Junipero Serra-Ocean-19<sup>th</sup>) and Lakeside Village (the commercial corridor on Ocean between 19<sup>th</sup> and Junipero Serra). I suspect that we are a rounding error for our population size. I'm hoping that this might work in our favor because we don't make a difference to either the District 4 or District 7 total numbers.

From the map that was on screen last night during public comment, did I understand correctly that it has been redrawn so that Lakeside One and Lakeside Village remain part of District 7?

If YES, I would like to update our community via email with the good news. If NO, since I couldn't stay on the call past 8PM last night to make a public comment, I would like to re-register our request to stay in District 7. Here's why:

- 1. We would like to stay with the rest of Lakeside 2 and 3 as a contiguous neighborhood from Sloat on the north side to where 19<sup>th</sup> and Junipero Serra meet towards I280. For decades, we have worked with the homeowner association and residents in Lakeside 2 and 3 on projects of mutual interest.
- 2. In particular, we work on many community projects with our District 7 supervisor's team and the small businesses, religious and other organizations, and schools such as SFUSD Commodore Sloat on Ocean in Lakeside Village (including just East of Junipero Serra). An example is the creation of a public park on Ocean from an underutilized parking lot where everything is offered to families at no charge. 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Dear Redistricting Committee,

I am a resident of Potrero Hill, on Kansas Street between 19th and 20th. The draft redistricting map cuts off a small portion of Kansas Street in the middle of Potrero Hill and groups it with the Mission. This would result in my neighbors across the street having different supervisor, and would make it literally impossible for us to collaborate on street safety issues and other neighborhood concerns. We are separated from the balance of the Mission District by the freeway and have no particular connection to most of that district, and I cannot imagine that the supervisor representing that district will pay any attention to a few isolated blocks across the freeway. We would effectively be disenfranchised. Instead of including the bizarre eastward divot shown in the map below, the district boundary should simply follow Potrero Avenue north consistently, or as a fallback, at least follow the curve of the freeway, which is a natural boundary of sorts, consistent with the neighborhood.

Adding back the area from Potrero Avenue to Kansas, 17th to 22nd, results in only adding 1.9% more population to the district. Further, adding Showplace Square from Potrero Avenue to the current District 10 boundaries would continue to result in a district within the 5% population deviation allowed under law to keep recognized neighborhoods and communities of interest together in a single district.

Please address this bizarre anomaly in future versions of the map, and do not cut off our small area from the rest of our neighborhood! Thank you.

Task Force,

While I sincerely appreciate all of the work you are doing to create equitable district maps, I cannot support the proposed the Map 2B that was presented on March 18th.

My strong belief is that North Beach, Russian Hill, Chinatown, the Downtown, and Barbary Coast neighborhoods are best served as a cohesive group in representation.

Please strongly consider the District 3 United Neighborhoods Proposed Plan.

This plan adjusts District 3's boundaries by simply extending the existing western boundary of Van Ness northward all the way to the Bay. This approach incorporates the missing "notch" bounded by Van Ness, Union St, Jones-Columbus-Leavenworth, and the Bay into D3. The remaining boundaries of D3 are unchanged.

This plan is similar to the one previously submitted by the Barbary Coast Neighborhood Association, North Beach Neighbors, Russian Hill Neighbors and other signatory organizations. It meets the Task Force's redistricting criteria while offering significant benefits, which include: • Uniting the Russian Hill neighborhood, which is currently split between D3 and D2. The Russian Hill Neighbors sent a letter to the Task Force on February 11 requesting a plan that unifies their

neighborhood and combines it with their peer neighborhoods in District 3. • Maintaining the integrity of existing neighborhoods (e.g., North Beach, Chinatown, Telegraph Hill, Russian Hill, Nob Hill, Polk Street, and Barbary Coast). This proposal does not create new splits in any neighborhood nor any new divisions in D3 racial/ethnic populations under the city charter. • Meeting the district population requirement within 1% of "ideal." The population of D3 with the current boundaries is 72,474 or 8.9% below the ideal number of 79,545. By extending the northwestern boundary to Van Ness, D3's population would be 78,908 a mere 0.8% below the ideal.

My name is Felisia Thibodeaux, and I work in District 11's Lakeview-OMI area. I have worked in the OMI for over 4 years. As a member of the INVEST BLACK Lakeview-OMI Coalition, I was noticeably upset with the first map published by this taskforce in the early part of March, which moved the OMI to District 7. District 7 encompasses neighborhoods like West Portal, St. Francis Woods, Sunnyside, and Lakeside. District 7 neighborhood's needs, demographics, and socio-economic levels are not comparable to the OMI which is largely composed of immigrants and communities of color. OMI was once over 70 percent African American residents but is now around 10 percent. Lakeview-OMI health disparities, food insecurity, and heavy reliance on public benefits requires it to remain connected to similar neighborhoods like the Excelsior, Outer Mission, and Crocker Amazon. Moreover, zip code 94112 needs to be under one supervisor based on the areas' complex needs.

INVEST BLACK Lakeview-OMI is extremely pleased and happy that you all have heard our concerns. We endorse the Redistricting Taskforce 2B map that was released on March 18, 2022. This map restores the OMI's investment along the Ocean Avenue Corridor that we lost in 2012 and returns Lakeview-OMI back to District 11. INVEST BLACK Lakeview-OMI also endorses SF Rising's Unity Map for District 11 which is nearly identical to this body's 2B Map. Both maps meet the needs of the Lakeview-OMI neighborhoods

I was recently notified that the City's redistricting plan for Supervisorial District includes a proposal to sever Lakeside One and Ocean Avenue between Junipero Serra and 19th Avenue from District 7. This would result in Lakeside II and Lakeside III being in a different district from Lakeside I.

Please reconsider and vote against this proposal. Lakeside I, II and III were built at approximately the same time for middle income families and have the same or very similar community of interest. They have many features in common, such as boundaries (19th Avenue and Junipero Serra), house style ( which include being detached, a feature not common throughout San Francisco and District 4), parking easements in Lakeside I an II, similar noise issues, a common retail area on Ocean Avenue between Junipero Serra and 19th Avenue, the same transportation amenities and issues, and underground utilities. I **strongly oppose** the proposed redefinition of District 3, as laid out in the March 18th Map 2B. It makes **NO rational sense.** I urge you to consider the following:

- -Columbus Avenue is NOT a boundary. It is the backbone of the neighborhood. Drawing the line there, as it does in Map 2B, would cut North Beach in half.
- -Please add all of Russian Hill to District 3 to balance population. This plan utilizes the natural boundaries of Van Ness and contiguous waterfront to Market Street.
