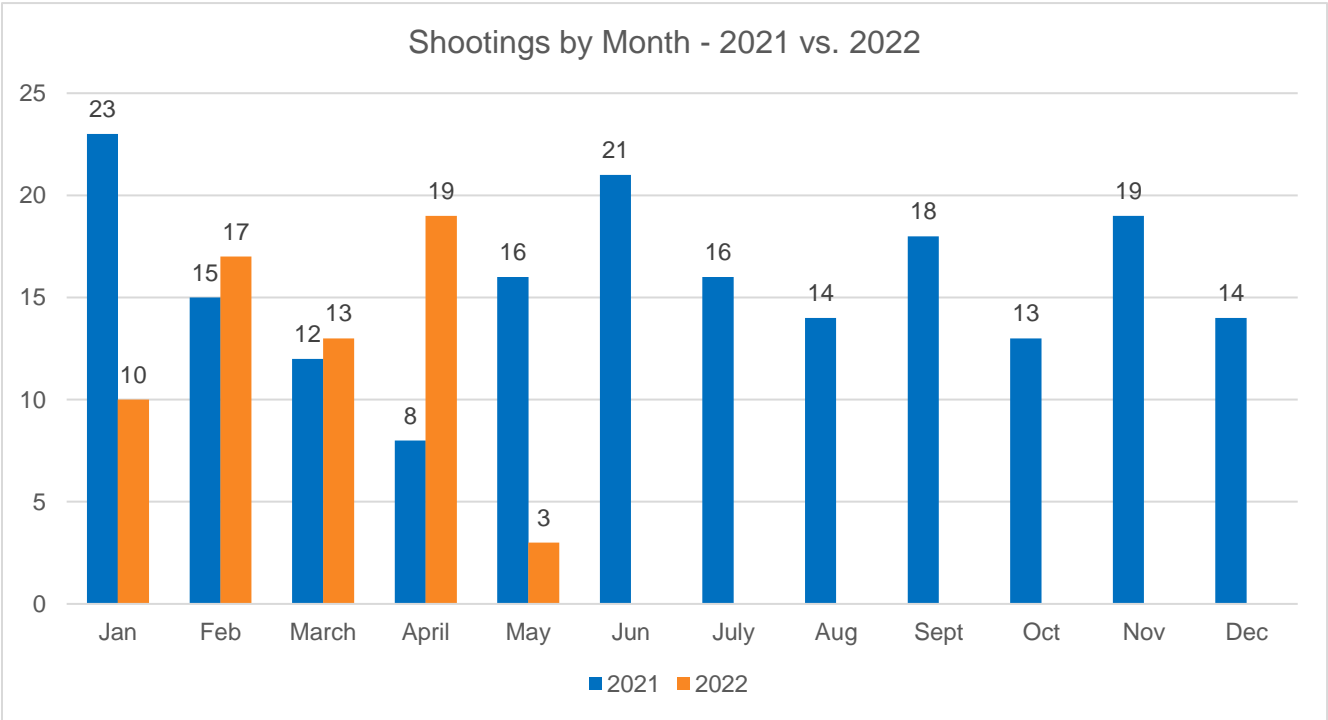

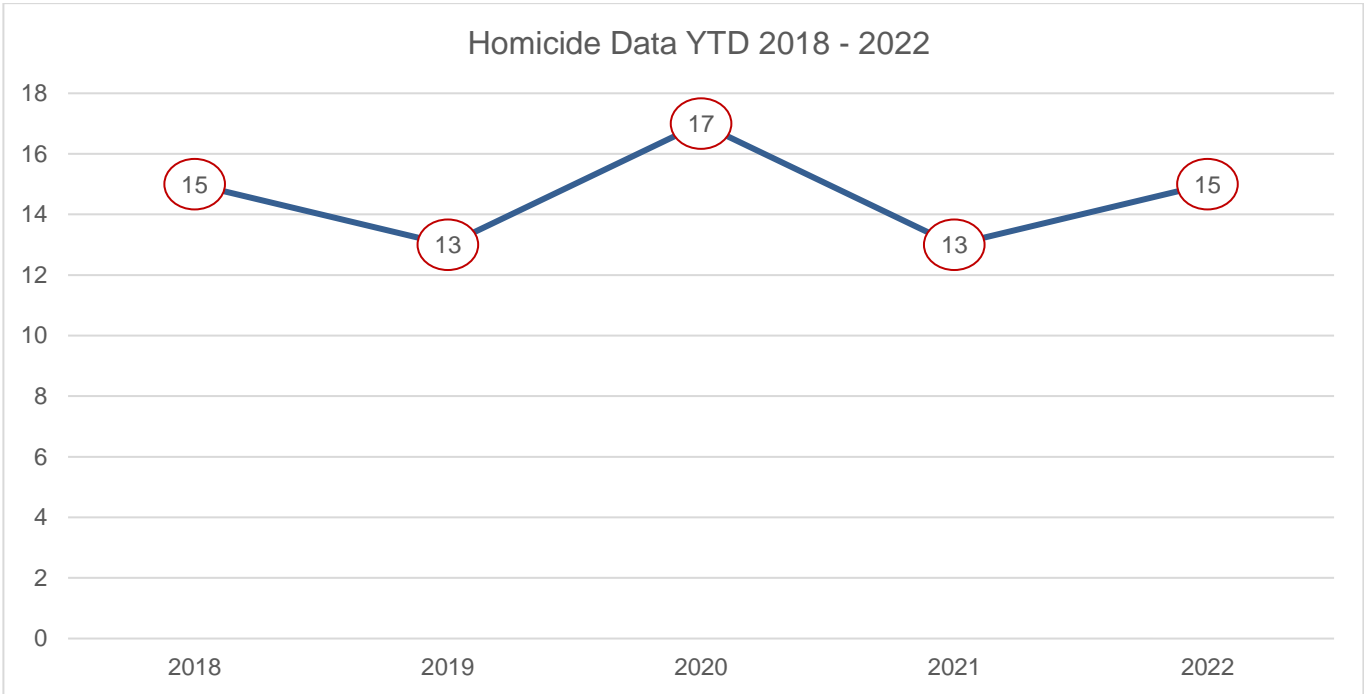
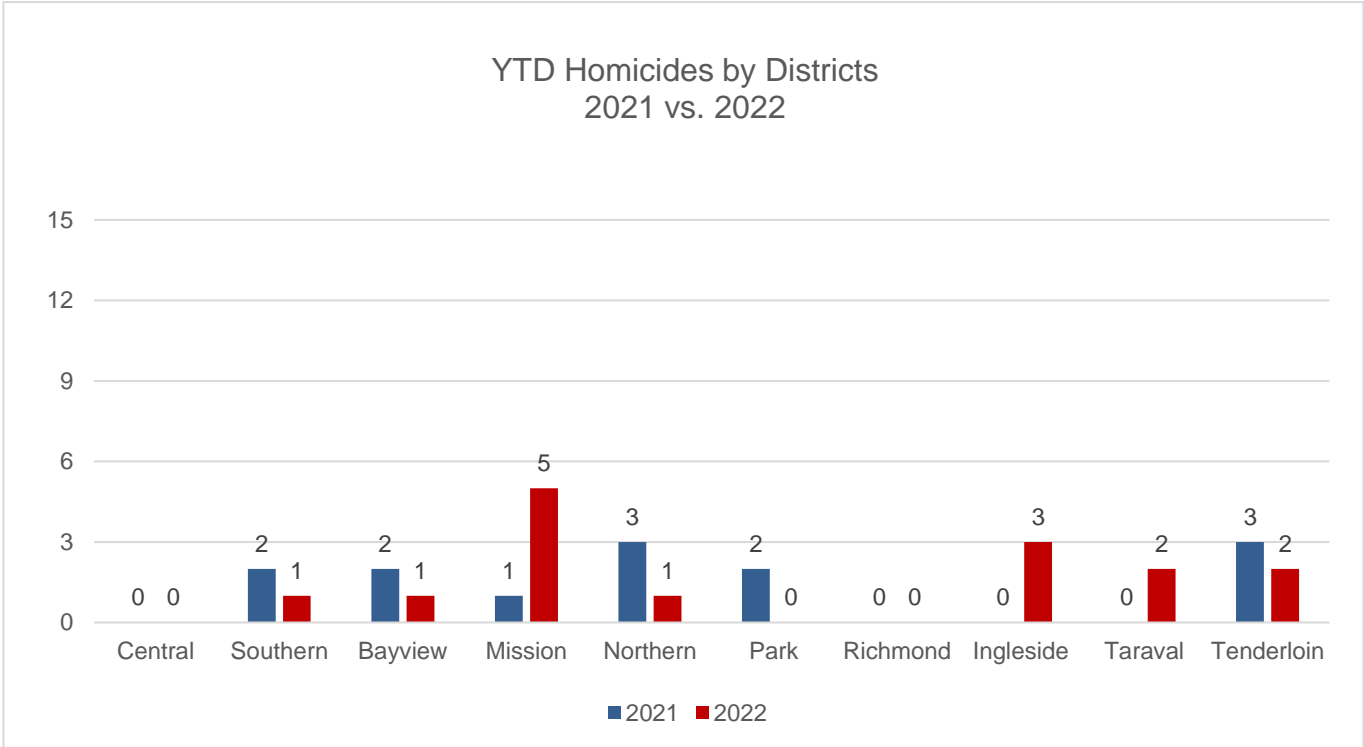
GUN VIOLENCE – Is DOWN 12% compared to 2021

- There were 2 shooting incidents for the week ending on 05/08/22
 - There are a total of 62 incidents resulting in 71 victims YTD
- There were NO homicides the week ending on 05/08/2022
 - There are 15 homicides YTD with 10 homicides resulting from a firearm.
 - Overall Clearance Rate: 53%
