(3/6) An off-duty Officer called 911 to report a drunk driver. During the call, an occupant from the vehicle in question fired a pistol as they were driving. Our units caught up to them and initiated a traffic stop. Arrests were made and a firearm was discovered + vehicle towed!

(5/6) Officers also stopped a vehicle for an illegal turn and found the driver exhibited symptoms of alcohol influence. SFSTs were performed poorly. Driver was unlicensed and on DUI probation for a prior DUI conviction. Blew 3x the legal limit and was arrested.







Focus on 5 Percentage 2022 1st Quarter vs. 2021 1st Quarter








