2016 Public Health and Safety Bond Primary Care Projects

Four Primary Care clinic projects currently in construction or completed:

- Maxine Hall Health Center Completed and re-occupied October 2021
- Southeast Health Center Occupancy July 2022
- Castro Mission Health Center Occupancy targeted for August 2022
- Maria X Martinez Health Services Center (previously known as Tom Waddell Urgent Care Clinic)* – occupancy targeted for October 2022

Extensive renovations of multiple buildings and units at Zuckerberg San Francisco General in construction or completed.



Maxine Hall Health Center

- Funded by 2016 PHS Bond and MOD
- Seismically safer building
- Added elevator
- Updated fire and life safety
- Added 7 additional patient exam rooms
- Upgraded facilities for staff (lactation room, staff lounge)
- Project developed and managed by DPW
- Project included painting, furniture, and other cosmetic upgrades to the co-located Westside Methadone Clinic
- Project completed October, 2021.



2nd Floor Layout Plans



Southeast Family Health Center

- Funded by 2016 PHS Bond and MHSA fund
- New construction, 2 floors and 22,000 square feet building
- Integrated primary care and behavioral health service
- Large multi-purpose room and offices on first floor for community use
- Renovated dental clinics opened in 2019
- Lab, podiatry, optometry and X-ray
- BHS teams will move into existing building
- Project developed and managed by DPW with significant community input



2nd Floor Layout

21 patient rooms total

- 5 consult rooms
- · A large family consult room
- · 16 exam rooms (4 additional)
- · 2 waiting rooms
- · Staff offices



Castro Mission Health Center

- Funded by 2016 PHS Bond and CalOES/FEMA
- Integrated primary care and behavioral health service
- GenderHealth SF will move into renovated building
- Expanded integrated behavioral health spaces, including for Dimensions Clinic
- Seismically safer building
- Updating fire and life safety
- Larger exam rooms
- Upgraded facilities for staff (lactation room, staff lounge)
- Newly added air conditioning
- Project developed by MEI Architects and managed by DPW

2nd Floor Layout



Maria X Martinez Health Services Center

- Funded by 2016 PHS Bond and 2020 DPH Certificates of Participation (COP)
- SFHOT administrative & support offices will share space
- Co-located on site are 250 Units of Permane Supportive Housing for Adults and Seniors to be owned and operated by Episcopal Community Services
- Will house expanded dental clinic, podiatry, and integrated behavioral health
- Project grew out of SF's work on Whole Person Care waiver: linking people with complex health needs to housing and benefit
- Project Developed by Mercy Housing
