## Status of Public Records Requests Made Pursuant to Senate Bills 1421 and 16 (SB 1421 and SB 16)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Until January 1, 2022, Penal Code § 832.7 required confidentiality for peace officer personnel records except in four categories: (1) officer involved shooting investigations, (2) uses of force that cause great bodily harm, (3) sustained findings of sexual assault, or (4) sustained findings of dishonesty. Records in these four categories are called "SB 1421" records after the 2019 senate bill that made them disclosable. On January 1, 2022, Senate Bill 16 ("SB 16") expanded these disclosable categories to include: (5) sustained findings of unreasonable or excessive force, (6) sustained findings of failure to intervene against another officer using excessive force, (7) sustained findings of unlawful arrest or search, and (8) sustained findings of biased policing.
