






Status of Internal Affairs Division Cases Opened in Q1 2022


Of the **59 cases opened** by IAD during Q1 2022, two cases were closed in the same quarter; 57 of those cases remained open at the end of the quarter.




Internal Affairs Division Cases Received in Q1 2022 by Source Type



Number of Allegations in Internal Affairs Division Cases Opened in Q1 2022




Member Classification Type in All Internal Affairs Division Cases Opened During Q1 2022










Source Type of the 46 Cases Closed by Internal Affairs Division during Q1 2022




Member Classification Type in the 46 Cases (143 Allegations) Closed by Internal Affairs Division during Q3 2021

Sex of Member in the 46 Cases (143 Allegations) Closed by Internal Affairs Division in Q1 2022






Of the **69 cases opened** by IAD during Q2 2022, three cases were closed in the same quarter; 66 of those cases remained open at the end of the quarter.




Internal Affairs Division Cases Received in Q2 2022 by Source Type



Number of Allegations in Internal Affairs Division Cases Opened in Q2 2022




Member Classification Type in Internal Affairs Division Cases Opened During Q2 2022










Source Type of the 51 Cases Closed by Internal Affairs Division during Q2 2022




Member Classification Type in the 51 Cases (182 Allegations) Closed by Internal Affairs Division during Q3 2021

Main Causes for Delays in Chief's Hearing

A Chief's Hearing requires the attendance of :

- Deputy Chief (Hearing Officer)
- DPA Attorney
- IAD Attorney
- Named Officer
- Officer's Representative/Attorney

IAD coordinates and sets the date for the Chief's Hearings.

 Timeline to schedule varies depending availability of officers, attorneys, and Deputy Chiefs.

Scheduling Issues/Requesting Continuance of hearings:

- Priority matters taking precedent
- Unscheduled meetings/events
- Other personal matters/scheduling conflicts

Proposed Revision/Modification to Chief's Hearing Process

- IAD Attorney reviewed current process for Chief's Hearing and proposed several options to modify the process.
- Chief Scott reviewed and approved the modifications.
- New process is more streamlined.
 - IAD Attorney will set a date/time for the Chief's Hearing with the Notice to Impose Discipline (NOID)
 - Past Practice 10 days for Member to request a hearing.
- New process will go in effect November 1, 2022.
