Highlights

Proposed, created, and launched the New Complainant look-up portalMade over 90 policy recommendations to SFPD to improve policing.

#1 Improper Conduct allegations -- Failure to comply with a Department General Order or Department Bulletin

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DPA investigated 68 cases where the events captured on the officer's body worn camera proved to be outcome determinative.




Cases Opened by Quarter



Allegations

Each allegation type has subtypes.

For example, the Neglect of Duty allegation category includes an officer's failure to activate a bodyworn camera and also an officer's failure to prepare an accurate incident report.




In Q1 - Q3 DPA brought a total of 1,676 allegations.




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How Complaints Were Received






Who are our complainants?




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Mediation – Highlights

- 17 Cases Mediated
- Neglect of Duty is the Most Common Complaint: Failure to take required action.
- Focused on providing on-roll call training for SFPD Officers
- Held mediator training with volunteer mediators
- Trained over 80 officers this year

10 Department General Orders Reviewed & Analyzed

90 Policy Recommendations

Worked with SFPD Crisis Intervention Unit to develop Disenegagement Policy

DPA Initiated a Department General Order Limiting Questioning and Searching Individuals on Probation, Parole, and Other Forms of Supervised Release



DPA Recommended limits on pretext stops



DPA collaborated with SFPD's Force Tactics Field Options (FTFO) Unit and recommended that SFPD adopt a foot pursuit policy to protect officer and public safety, and to reduce the uses of force associated with foot pursuits.



Senate Bill 1421- Highlights



Audit-Highlights

DPA currently has two audits in-progress.

The first audit is to look into SFPD's handling of officer misconduct. San Francisco Charter requires DPA to conduct regular audits on this topic. (Fieldwork phase)

The second audit looks at SFPD's compliance with its guidelines for First Amendment activities. (Information gathering phase)

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DPA continues to follow up on SFPD's implementation of recommendations made in our report titled The Police Department Needs Clearer Guidance and More Proactive Governance for Better Use-of-Force Data Collection and Reporting
