HOMICIDE REWARDS – HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

- The SFPD, in consultation with the Mayor's Office, decide which cases qualify for a reward and how much the award will be.
- In 2016, the Board of Supervisors, led by then-Board President London Breed, introduced and passed an ordinance adding Section 10.100-306 to the Administrative Code establishing the Homicide Reward Fund.
- In 2017, the SFPD established a process, Unit Order 17-01, to comply with the tenets of the Homicide Reward Fund.



HOMICIDE REWARD FUND

Admin Code Section 10.100-306 established the Homicide Reward Fund

- Chief of Police has full discretion to establish a reward and its amount based on:
 - The nature of the crime and the length of time
 - The difficulty of the investigation and prosecution
- The reward may be paid to an individual(s) in consultation with the District Attorney upon the successful prosecution of the case based on:
 - The usefulness of the information furnished by the person
 - The individual(s) may not have participated in planning, commission, or concealing of the crime
- If the distribution of the award exceeds \$100,000, the Board of Supervisors shall approve the payout by resolution.



ESTABLISHING REWARDS

- Investigations Bureau Unit Order 17-01 outlines the procedures for requesting a reward for an unsolved homicide.
- The lead Homicide Investigator can request a reward when all investigative leads have been exhausted including any viable leads to identify a suspect.
- The Chief determines the starting amount of the reward, which can be increased up to the allowable \$250,000.









REWARD PAYOUTS

Every homicide tip is evaluated and investigated by the assigned Homicide sergeant to prove or disprove the information. The information is either:

- Unsubstantiated and remains in the case file
- Substantiated but does not lead to an arrest
- Substantiated, leads to an arrest, and the successful prosecution of the case, at which point reward may be paid out



In 2013, a payment of \$250,000 (reward established by the Mayor) was made to a person who came forward with information that led to the identification, arrest, and conviction of the person responsible for the murder of Willie Allen in 2006.
