Biography:

Jacob Denney is SPUR's economic justice policy director, where he leads research and advocacy efforts to ensure that all people in the San Francisco Bay Area are economically secure. He has worked across the country on issues related to the criminal legal system and other systems that disproportionately impact low-income and working people. Jacob was the policy and research director at the Insight Center, a national racial and economic justice organization. He has been a researcher focused on criminal legal systems at the Pew Charitable trusts, a researcher and advocate focused on fines and fees for the Southern Poverty Law Center, and began his career working in the Massachusetts State Senate. Jacob received his Master of Public Policy from the Price School of Public Policy at the University of Southern California and his B.A. in political philosophy from UMass Boston.
