2. General Public Comment

4. Report by Treasure Island Director

Bob Beck, Treasure Island Director, presented an update on development and operation issues. The YMCA Gym has reopened. During closure after school programs were held at the Shipshape. Day and Night Music Festival was held 10/15-10/16. The Entertainment Commission and TIDA received noise complaints from Berkeley area during festival.

There was a firework display 10/19 in conjunction with a filming permit.

Two RFPs have been advertised, one for transitional housing advisory services and one for environmental program oversight.

Three Villages households are working to purchase inclusionary units at the Bristol.

Environmental lawsuit has been dismissed and the window for appealing the dismissal has lapsed.

The National Director of Job Corps programs under the Department of Labor visited in October to tour existing center see work underway on the island.

State Lands Commission representative visiting this Thursday.

Nella Goncalves, One Treasure Island, gave an update.

The Mobile Covid Clinic has been discontinued and now residents can get take home Covid tests from the nurse's clinic and One TI.

Construction Training Program graduated 11 students on October 28th.

Supplemental transportation study is wrapping up. Planning with SFCTA to prepare final report and recommendations.

Halloween event was a success and over 250 people attended.

Resource line is still active.

Director Richardson commented on noise from TI events and asked what can be done differently. Director Breston commented on security marking cars over the weekend for parking violations and need to communicate parking policies to residents and housing providers.

Director Richardson requested an outline for TIDA to respond to misinformation.

Director Dunlop reiterated resident confusion with parking policies.
