PUBLIC COMMENT General Public Comment: At this time, members of the public may address the FSTF on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the task force but do not appear on the agenda. With respect to agenda items, the public will be given an opportunity to address the Committee when the item is reached in the meeting. Each member of the public may address the Committee for up to three minutes. The Brown Act forbids a Committee from taking action or discussing any item not appearing on the posted agenda, including those items raised at Public Comment. In response to public comment on an item that is not on the agenda, the Committee is limited to: - Briefly responding to statements made or questions posed by members of the public, or - Requesting staff to report back on a matter at a subsequent meeting, or - Directing staff to place the item on a future agenda. (Government Code Section 54954.2(a).) 10. Each action item will hold public comment before a vote is made.

\*Persons who are unable to attend the meeting may submit, by the time of the beginning of the meeting, written comments regarding the subject of the meeting. These written comments will be made a part of the official public record, and the comments will be brought to the attention of the persons conducting the meeting.
