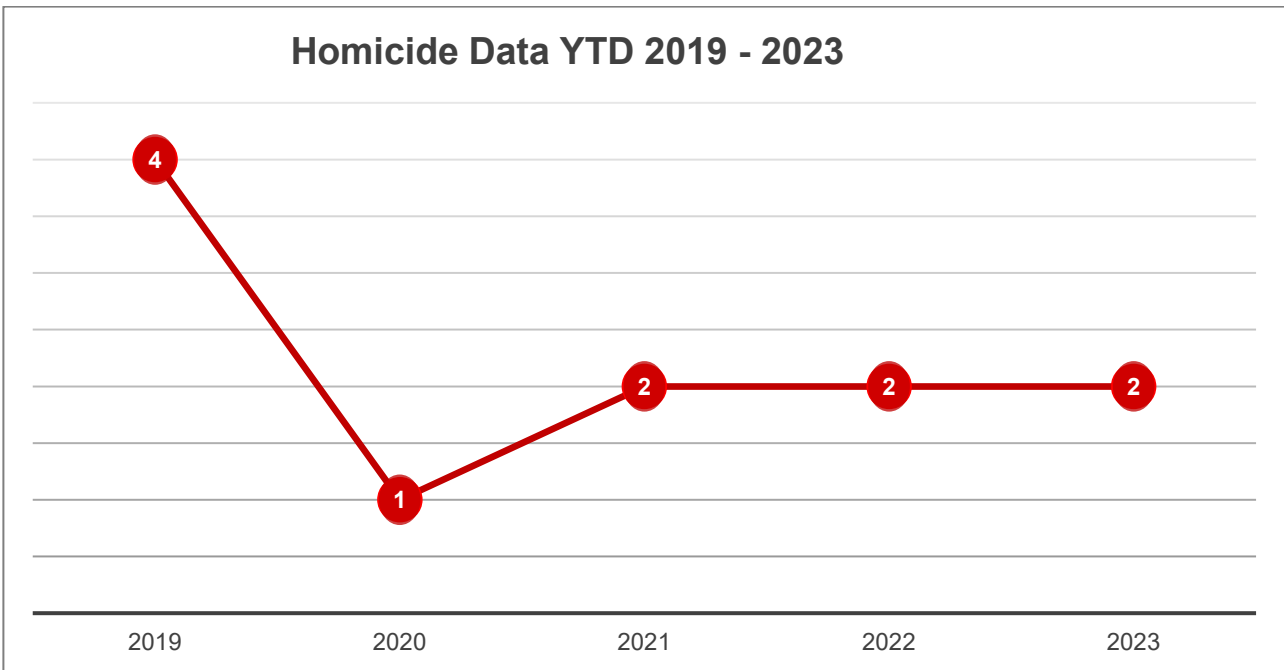
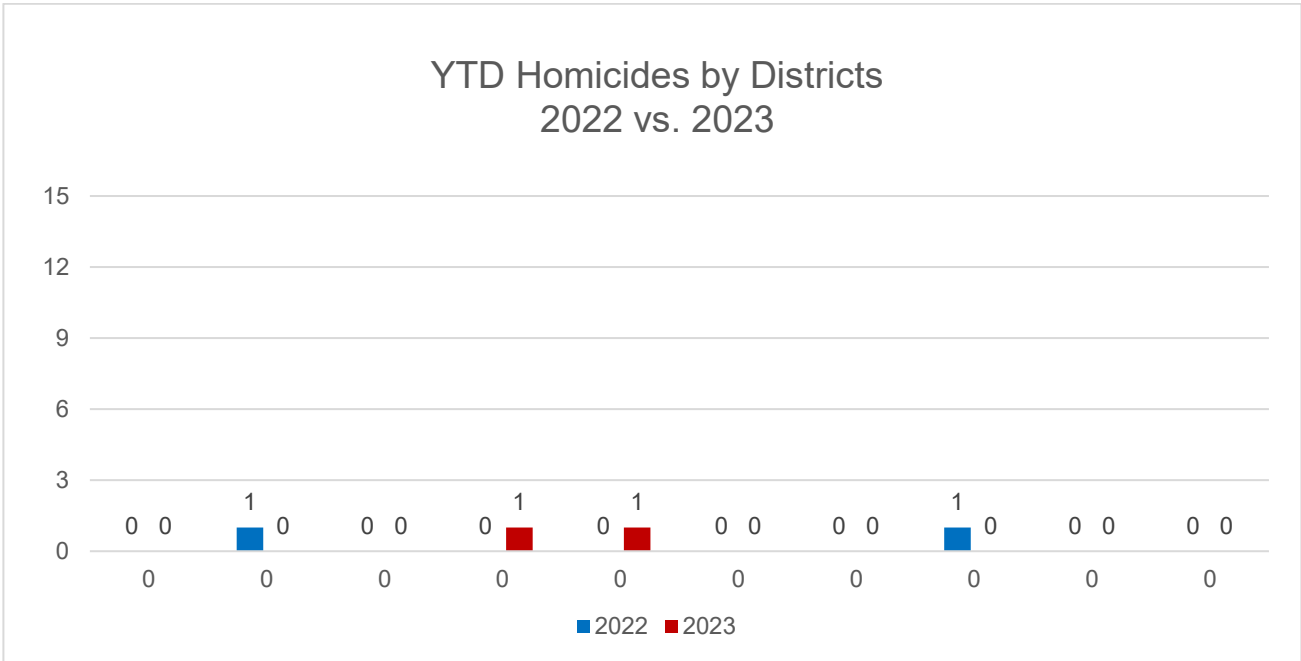
**GUN VIOLENCE – Is UP 83% compared to 2022**

- **There were 3 shooting incident causing injuries to 3 individuals this week.**
  - For the year, there are a total of 8 incidents resulting in 11 victims
- **There were no homicides.**
  - There are 2 homicides YTD with 2 incidents resulting from a firearm.
    - **Overall Clearance Rate: 50%**
