## Additional Data

SF ACC placed 189 animals in foster homes during this quarter

Fostered: 134 cats, 24 dogs, 31 others ( 20 rabbits, 6 hamsters, 5 guinea pigs). Many of these fostered animals went on to be adopted from us, while many other animals were transferred to our adoption partners

ACOs responded to 2,453 emergency calls for service this quarter
SF ACC received 6 calls regarding sightings of healthy, free-roaming cats this quarter
