#### **Purpose of Contract:**

CarePort's software will generate a "Choice List" to be used by DPH patients that identifies Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF) and Home Health Agencies that have both bed availability and will accept the patients' payor. This will be done through an interface with Epic that allows for clinical documents and patient demographic information to be accessed and attached to referrals that can be electronically sent to qualified providers.

The "Choice List" generated for the patient and/or the patient's family will include up-to-date quality data and can be provided electronically or as a hard copy. The system must also be able to refer the patient to the selected SNFs or Home Health Providers with other documentation in Epic required for the referral (Face Sheet, Med orders, Discharge Summary, etc.).

CarePort Health LLC is a care coordination network with thousands of providers connected across the U.S. The end-to-end platform bridges acute and post-acute EHR data, providing visibility into the entire patient journey for providers, physicians, payers and Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs). With CarePort, healthcare professionals can coordinate patient care to track and manage patients as they move through the system. CarePort helps providers meet and comply with the patient event notification Condition of Participation, as part of the CMS Interoperability and Patient Access final rule, and the IMPACT Act.
