Detention Decisionmaking Tool (DDT)

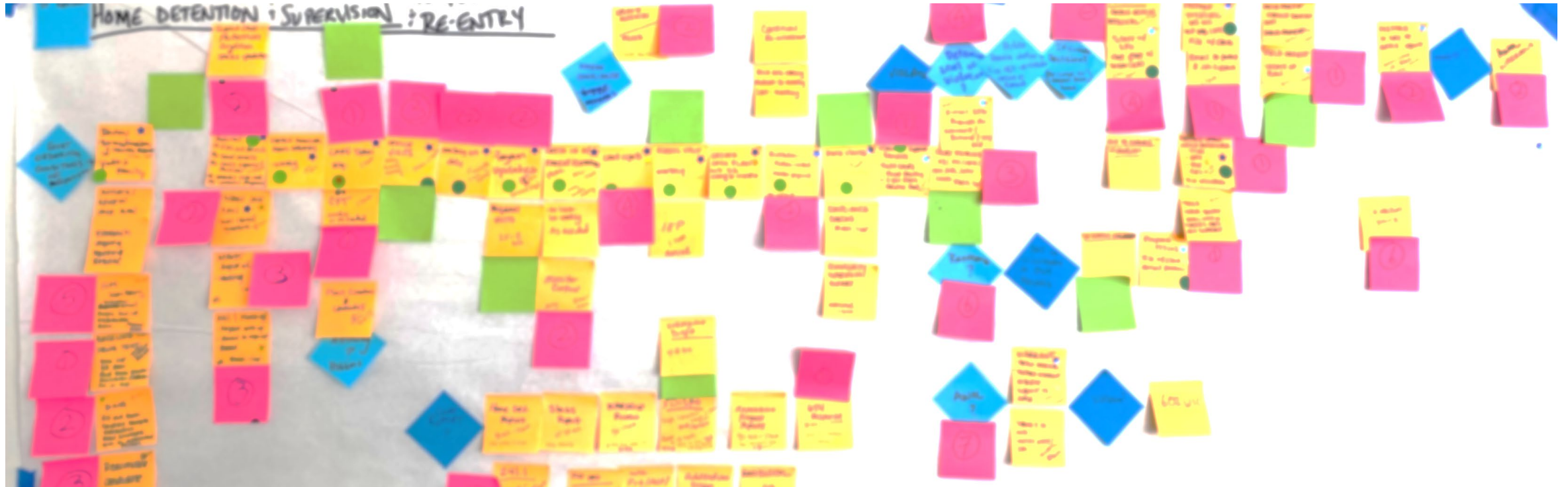
As of March 1, 2023, JPD has retired the Detention Risk Instrument (DRI) and launched the DDT, as presented to the Commission in October 2021.

Circumstance	Detention Consideration	Action
Youth is at least 14 years old, arrested for personal use of a firearm in the attempt or commission of a felony	Mandatory Detention, pursuant to State Law	Detain
Youth is at least 14 years old, arrested for any offense listed in Welfare and Institutions Code section 707(b).	Mandatory Detention, pursuant to State Law	Detain
Youth of any age brought into custody pursuant to a court order, bench warrant, or arrest warrant.	Mandatory Detention, pursuant to Court Order	Detain
Youth of any age transferred in custody from another jurisdiction.	Mandatory Detention, pursuant to Court Order	Detain
Felony firearm offense (use or possession)	JPD Policy, based on nature of offense	Detain
Other jurisdiction hold (“courtesy hold”)	JPD Policy, based on circumstance	Detain
Placement return or failure - non-secure option not available	JPD Policy, based on safety of minor	Detain
Parent/guardian not available or willing – non-secure option not available	JPD Policy, based on safety of minor	Detain
None of the above		Cite & Release

DDT: Detain with Supervisor Approval

- Not an “override.”
- If the On-Duty Officer/ Senior Counselor determines that relevant factors in addition to those already contemplated on the DDT should be considered in the detention decision, the On-Duty Officer/ Senior Counselor may seek to detain with supervisor approval from the **Assistant Chief** or the **Director of Probation Services**.
- In seeking approval to detain, the On-Duty Officer/ Senior Counselor will provide justification of the factors considered when making this decision:
 - Why is continued detention of the minor a matter of immediate and urgent necessity for the protection of the minor or reasonable necessity for the protection of the person or property of another, and/or why is the minor a flight risk?
