### **Purpose of Agreement:**

The Homeless Prenatal Program received a grant award from a private grantor thru the Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital Foundation to support the Department's Solid Start Initiative program. The Homeless Prenatal

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Program will provide for coordinated care services that include but are not limited to case management, navigation, referrals and linkages to care in collaboration with the ZSFGH Solid Start program. The Solid Start program at ZSFGH promotes patient centered whole person care, health equity, innovations in service delivery, integration of health and social services, multi-agency collaboration, and increased access to services and resources through an integrated care coordination, encircling all pregnant persons and their children.

There will be non-medical and outpatient case management, non-medical case management is provided in the clinics at the hospital, while outpatient case management is provided in collaboration with the ZSFGH Midwives offsite at the Homeless Prenatal Program. Services will include navigation, care coordination, referrals and linkages to care including food security, safe sleep, strollers/care seats, and diapers, and support group meetings. The Homeless Prenatal Program will partner with Solid Start and 5M leadership to establish workflows and processes that will enable Community Health Workers to provide for patient-centered care. 5M is the Obstetrics, Midwifery, and Gynecology clinic at ZSFGH.

#### Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-up:

This Agreement will receive annual monitoring through the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC), including for performance and fiscal stability.

#### Health Equity and Inclusion Compliance:

The Vendor will provide the necessary information to comply with the Department's Office of Health Equity (OHE) requirements and will work collaboratively to remove systemic and operational barriers that impede providing appropriate levels of services to meet the needs of disadvantaged BIPOC stakeholders and communities.

#### Sole Source:

The Agreement is authorized under the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 21G.10(b) for Grant Agreements. The Homeless Prenatal Program received a grant award from a private grantor thru the Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital Foundation to support the Department's Solid Start Initiative program.
