I am a self taught artists inspired by a desire to participate in our spiritual evolution by sharing in a dialog facilitated by my hand made visual art. I create figurative devotional statues and works that show a persons energy body or provide visual aids for meditation exercises. I consider the right to sell and display my work to be protected by the first amendment on the basis of free speech assembly and free exercise of religion. I plan to go forward with communicating with the public while exercising my right to work through sales.

1. Describe your work in detail. How do you make it?

Handmade sculpture. Primarily figurative work, ranging from 3 to 14 inches. Most is painted. Some realistically detailed, some with a series of washes to highlight features, some unpainted as is the modern style. I start with an idea and make a figure in a hard plasticine. Then make a silicon mold. Then I usually cast it in Hydrostone, a brand of hard statuary plaster/cement. Sometimes I cast in polyester resin and dye and/or illuminate the figures or letters with LEDs. If the figure is to painted I prime with Kilz Adhesive Primer and appropriate pigments. Then I paint with oils or acrylic and apply a varnish to seal the piece.

Learned on my own. Working with clay. Some books for mold making. Also from advice from craft people at "Douglas and Sturges"
