The site is a long retaining wall on Upper Market St., where the mural has been an iconic neighborhood landmark for 40 years. The abstract landforms are meant to reflect the strata of the hill behind the concrete retaining wall, which was built in 1945. At the time the original mural was painted, there was less awareness of the effects of climate change and land usage. But since then, the mural has stood to remind us that humans in the urban setting still partake of the land's power. The strong color and sweeping forms are intended to remind viewers of this, as they walk or drive up Market Street. |

Civ. Code §§987 and 989)("CAPA"), and/or any other local, state, foreign or international law, as currently drafted or as may be hereafter amended, that conveys the same or similar rights ("Moral Rights Laws"), with respect to the Work, its display, removal from display, exhibition, installation, conservation, storage, study, alteration and any other activities conducted by the City, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees, successors or assigns. If the Work is incorporated into a building such that the Work cannot be removed from the building without physical defacement, mutilation, alternation, distortion, destruction, or other modification (collectively, "Modification") of the Work, Artist waives any and all such claims under any Moral Rights Laws arising out of or against any current or future owners of the site, and its agents, officers and employees, for Modification of the Work.

The City has the absolute right to change, modify, destroy, remove, relocate, move, replace, transport, repair or restore the Work, in whole or in part, in City's sole discretion.

The City has no obligation to pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage to the Work done without the City's authorization. However, the City may pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage or to restore the Work if the work has been modified without the City's authorization. If the City pursues such a claim, it shall notify the Artist, and Artist shall cooperate with the City's efforts to prosecute such claims.

If the City modifies the Work without the Artist's consent in a manner that is prejudicial to Artist's reputation, Artist retains the right to disclaim authorship of the Work in accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 106A (a) (2).

Artist bears the sole responsibility for providing the City with any changes to the Artist's Address for Notice. Notice of changes must be mailed to the Arts Commission, 401 Van Ness Avenue, Suite 325, San Francisco, CA 94102 AND to the City Agency with jurisdiction over the property.

Dear Esteemed Arts Commissioners,

This additional letter addresses the maintenance of the proposed mural restoration on Market and 18th Streets. There have been minimal maintenance requirements of this mural since it was originally painted in 1983. The muralist, Betsie Miller-Kusz, has assured the EVNA that the materials she will be using to perform restoration work are resistant to graffiti and other damage. There has not been a lot of formal maintenance nor need for formal maintenance at this site since 1983.

However, the EVNA, in conjunction with the artist, Betsie Miller-Kusz, are willing to accept ongoing responsibility for paying for and performing maintenance for this mural. This includes paying for graffiti abatement as necessary, and paying for paint touch-ups and other needed maintenance items.
