MOHCD Divisions

- Housing division focuses on creating housing policies and programs that create safe, stable, and affordable housing.
- <u>Community Development</u> division works with a broad network of community-based partners to create an inclusive and equitable City where all residents can thrive.
- Homeownership and Below Market Rate (HBMR) division focuses on implementing Inclusionary programs and ensuring that City-sponsored affordable housing is accessible to the people it is intended to serve.
- <u>Finance and Administration</u> division ensures that the department has the financial, human, and technological resources necessary to manage our investments and policies.



Housing Production and Preservation

- From FY 21-23 delivered 2,284 units of new 100% affordable housing,
 792 units began construction or rehabilitation in 2022
- Since 2014 acquisition and preservation programs investments have preserved 50 projects with 39 commercial spaces, and 519 residential units. In FY 21-22 Preservation and Seismic Safety Program closed on 5 projects with 120 units and 12 commercial spaces.
- Since 2020 MOHCD has issued five procurements. Three are active –
 Educator Housing, Site Acquisition, Capital Repairs



Housing Production and Preservation

- Expansion of Small Sites Program Qualified Non-Profit list to include CBOs serving Western Addition and Bayview and with stated mission of serving African American residents
- Inclusion of leadership diversity reporting and advancing racial equity scoring in housing production procurements
- Establishment of the Emerging Developers program with Urban Land Institute to expand engagement with smaller BIPOC firms and build affordable housing developer pool
- Revision of procurements for affordable housing projects to recognize opportunity for accelerated state funding through emerging developer state financing pool



Homeownership and Below Market Rate

- From January 2018 through March 2023, a total of 741,954 applications were submitted through DAHLIA. 97,554 identified as Black/African American.
- From January 2018 through March 2023, a total of 2,589 residents were placed in rental and ownership housing units for which MOHCD conducted housing lotteries in DAHLIA. Of the 2,589 placements, 287 heads of household identified as Black/African American.
- As of Jan. 12: 22 new homeowners, 10 in contract, 100+ engaged in counseling/preparing to purchase through Dream Keeper Downpayment Assistance Loan Program



Homeownership and Below Market Rate

- Conducted analysis of perceived and potential process barriers for African Americans applying for BMR units. Incorporated recommended changes into BMR and home ownership programs
- Ongoing coordination with Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure in the implementation of state legislation expand eligibility of COP preference
- Investing in the cultural competency training for housing counseling agencies



Community Development

- In FY21-22, procured \$67.4 million in grant funding from General Fund to community-based organizations. 11% of the FY2021-22 budget went to organizations that primarily served Black/African Americans.
- In FY21-22, procured \$5.8 million in grant funding from federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to community-based organizations



Community Development

- Incorporation of targets for African American served into grant agreement for programs and services that citywide
- Streamlined the capacity building grant program better align with operational capacity needs
- Ongoing administration of African American led CBO capacity building program
- Ongoing training to property managers and housing service providers on trauma informed service
