Committee Discussion about Eligibility and action.

• Reparations programs should also be payable to those native San Franciscans forced from the city by adverse housing and tenant policies, gentrification, and ongoing racist policies, i.e. redlining, affordable housing, redevelopment, eviction, Hope SF, the false narrative that affordable housing and the housing lottery (will trickle down to us), and also meet the requirements that this harm also happened between 1940 and 1996.

Motion to adopt language, "With an agreement to continue discussion @ 1996 eligibility end date. 1st Gloria Berry. 2nd Nikcole Cunningham;

Motion adopted by acclimation.

- When one discusses Reparations we must consider a number of factors. One factor that must be addressed is the Union Army soldiers who fought for their own freedoms. Added this to history section of the report.
- There needs to be a distinction between African Americans and immigrants/descendants of immigrants. These payments need to go directly to African Americans. Added to the eligibility requirements.
- Research language used from 1940 thru 1996 on government documents for review and addition *review in the Policy Subcommittee.*
- Member Landry requested that the staff and members will research language used on local, state, and federal government documents describing Black/African American people in the eligibility section to be as inclusive as possible.
- Motion to adopt language, "An individual born in SF and displaced by the child welfare system should be eligible. including those coming out of the foster care system." 1st Member Cunningham, 2nd Member Carter; Motion carried unanimously.
