- 1.0 The meeting was called to order. Roll call found a quorum of committee members were present.
- 2.0 Approval of the minutes of the Code Advisory Committee special meeting of January 11, 2023.
  - There was a motion to approve the minutes as written.
  - Seconded and approved.

- 3.0 Election of the Code Advisory Committee Chair and Vice-Chair. The term of office for each is one year and will commence immediately upon election results.
  - There was a motion to nominate and elect Ned Fennie to be the Chair of the CAC for 2023 and Stephen Harris to be the Vice-Chair.

Seconded and approved.

4.0 Discussion and possible action regarding proposed ordinance amending the Police and Building Codes to require owners of certain residential construction projects to maintain a labor compliance bond at the time of issuance of the first construction document. (FILE NO. 230134).

The possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission (BIC) for their further action.

#### Discussion:

- Adam Thongsavat from Supervisor Mandelman's office made a presentation about the proposed ordinance.
- Project sponsors can secure the bond when they are issued a permit to begin a construction.
- There was a question if any example people didn't get paid or there was a labor issue.
- Adam Thongsavat clarify that the bond requirements had been already passed last year and this is clean up legislation.
- There was a comment that it should not be limited to 10 units and the requirement should apply to new construction of 0 unit or more.
- There was a discussion regarding the cost to carry the bond.
- There was a concern how DBI will enforce the bond requirement and if DBI will add a new permit review station.
- There was a concern the bond requirement and the proving process will slow down the permitting process.

Public Comment: No public comment.

#### Action:

- There was a motion to approve the proposed legislation and make the recommendation to the BIC. Seconded and approved.
- There was a motion stated as below:

CAC does not support the original legislation mainly due to it will increase the cost of construction. If the original legislation cannot be rescinded, then the CAC requests documentation regarding the labor issue, the unit numbers, project size, the bond amounts and to exclude remodel projects. Seconded and approved.

5.0 Discussion and possible action regarding proposed ordinance amending the Planning and Building Codes to codify the annual waiver of awning replacement fees and awning fees applied for during the month of May. (File No. 230212)

The possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission (BIC) for their further action.

- DBI Legislative Manager Carl Nicita made a presentation regarding the proposed ordinance.
- Since November last year, DBI received about 200 anonymous complaints about unpermitted existing awnings.

- This fee waiver program is an attempt to help businesses come into compliance.
- There was a discussion regarding legalizing existing awnings.
- Carl Nicita said the Mayor's office and Supervisor Peskin's office are working on legislation regarding an amnesty program.

Public Comment: No public comment.

#### Action:

There was a motion stated as below:

The CAC understands that the legislation addressing the bigger issue of existing awnings in San Francisco is being written right now. However, without that in front of us, these are the issues we have with and then there are two amendments to include legalization of existing unpermitted or non-conforming awnings. Seconded and approved.

6.0 Discussion and possible action regarding updated Administrative Bulletin 093 – "Implementation of Green Building Regulations".

The possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission (BIC) for their further action.

- San Francisco Department of Environment Green Building Coordinator Barry Hooper made a presentation regarding the changes to AB–093.
- Mr. Hooper said updates to AB-93 reflect changes which have already been adopted in in the code.
- Green Building Subcommittee had reviewed the changes and made a recommendation to CAC to approve the proposed changes.
