

VRI GOALS

- Reduce gang/group related shootings and homicides
- Reduce the recidivism rate of participants
- Build community police trust

Area of Focus: District 10

District 10 Gun Violence Dynamics

Problem Analysis

Two distinct but overlapping dynamics drive serious violence in San Francisco:

- **Group Dynamics**: A majority of <u>gun</u> homicides (53%-70%) and non-fatal shootings (50-77%) are driven by or connected to street group dynamics.
 - Those at the highest risk of <u>gun</u> violence in San Francisco are primarily 18-35, Black and Latino men with extensive justice system histories (13-15 prior arrests); and social connections to these groups and conflicts.
- Street Disorder: A significant minority of homicides and non-fatal shootings are driven by interconnected street homeless / mental illness (19%) and drug market dynamics (18%), primarily in the Tenderloin area.

Recent Analysis on Bayview & Ingleside in 2022

- Average age of shooting victim: 30
- Average age of shooting suspect: 28*


2022: Year of Transition

- 1824 Principal Analyst


In response, Chief Scott made intentional decisions to bring on staff to support the work on the ground and eventually at a managerial level.

SF Gun Violence Rates Bayview & Ingleside




