SF ACC placed **47** animals in foster homes during this quarter

Fostered: 3 cats, 25 dogs, 19 others (6 rabbits, 6 guinea pigs, 4 hamsters, 3 rats). Many of these fostered animals went on to be adopted from us, while many other animals were transferred to our adoption partners

ACOs responded to 2,223 emergency calls for service this quarter

SF ACC received 5 calls regarding sightings of outdoor cats this quarter

0 Cats were transported to the Feral Fix/Community Cat Program
