There was no time for my art, but I made sure my own children were involved at the Jr Museum taking various classes, woodworking being their favorite. Both are very capable in this skill, working on their own homes. It's amazing what early training can do for confidence. When I retired, I took various classes at Sharon Arts Studio and CCSF. Finally, I landed in ceramics with a full commitment. Eventually, I built a studio in my backyard which I use to throw pots, carve, and decorate. I then fire them at Clay Creations I haven't sold my pottery at any fairs yet. I have a four foot table and plan to cover it with black cloth. Maybe I'll set some boxes on it to show different levels for my work.

I make pottery on the wheel, and the carve designs. I then use underglazes to paint. Then it is fired at a studio. Then I use black glaze to fill in the carvings washing off the excess. I then use a clear glaze over the entire design and often use a colored glaze to offer contrast on the outer or inner part of the piece.
