Dear Members of the Police Commission,

I'm appalled that your commission is being asked to penalize the police for doing their job. The Dolores Steet Hill Bomb should be a fun, violence-free event enjoyed by the participants without endangering the neighborhood, visitors, residents, pets, traffic or Muni. Instead what I observed was something on Saturday, July 8, that deteriorated into attacks, vandalism, bullet holes in buildings and parked cars, and refusal by way too many to disperse when requested to do so. Ample time was given by the police for the crowd to disperse yet many of them chose not to comply. The police have an obligation to protect public safety and it was clear to me that public safety was greatly at risk.

My name is David Lieb; I am a homeowner and resident living 1 block from Dolores Park with my wife and two young children. I am writing in support of the SFPD's actions at the recent Hill Bomb event. Thank you for preventing any serious injuries or deaths this year.

Two years ago, I remember trying to take my 10 month old daughter to the Dolores Park playground during the Hill Bomb event. Sadly, we were just steps away from the cyclist who was killed.

Last year, I was driving our family home and had to pass through the intersection at Dolores and 20th St. to reach our home. My wife was literally screaming in fear as a sideshow occupied the intersection and came just feet from striking our vehicle. Rioters passed on both sides of our car. My 1 year old daughter was frightened seeing her parents so scared.

This year, we were forced to leave our own neighborhood during the event to avoid the risks to our safety. Thankfully the SFPD showed up to enforce the laws of our city, and they did a tremendous job in a very challenging spot.

My hope is that next year, I might be able to take my kids to watch the Hill Bomb event knowing that they will be safe doing so. This is what we should aspire to in our city -- enforce the laws, but also embrace the unique culture that is the reason so many of us have committed to raising our children here.

We support the Police enforcing the laws of our city, and we will never, never, give up.

Dear City and Police Leaders,

I have been reading and watching the reactions of members from different communities to try and understand what is and has been going on with this event. As a professor of rhetoric at both Stanford and the University of San Francisco, I have begun to analyze the statements and actions (or inactions) around the hill bomb. As I have been doing this, I feel I have things to bring up, that I have not yet heard in any other statements about the event, and I hope you will indulge me in my analysis.

Roughly 10 years ago, a group of skaters decided that they were going to take over a street so they could bomb down it on their skateboards.

The event was not then, and has not been since, sanctioned or approved by the city.

They rhetorical position of the skaters has been “we want to do this, and we are going to do this, no matter what you do”.

With just this simple framework, one could say the skaters have instituted and perpetuated an aggressive act to take over a space and use it for their purposes.

Now, any protest would do something similar. Is this a protest? If it is, I don’t know what the point of the protest is. To me, that says the skaters have not done a good job of communicating their protest, if it is in fact one.

Another example of something similar might be Critical Mass, which was a protest of bicyclists to car drivers and city leaders, that bikes had just as much right to the road as anyone else and thus demanded a sharing of street space.

Is the Bomb the Hill akin to Critical Mass? Maybe, but again, if it is, I have not heard what it is that the skaters are demanding, beyond taking over the hill.

Skaters – is there a message you are trying to tell society with this Hill Bomb? If so, what is it?

As someone who lives a few doors down from Dolores Street and the Hill Bomb, what I have seen at each of these events is a joy of youth taking over a street and having a great time bombing down the hill.

So why did the police, this year, decide to shut it down, if the kids are just having fun? I can’t speak for the police, but as a community member, I imagine they see that this event, every single time it has happened, has not ended the way it began. It begins with “good clean fun” and ends with destruction of property, setting off of M-80’s and other fireworks, fights, etc... In other words, we have 10 years of data that shows

the physical and psychological degradation of the neighborhood and its residents at these events.

I have heard some accuse the city of not reaching out to the skaters and working to build better rapport. If the skaters want good rapport, then why does the Hill Bomb devolve into destructive behavior every year? If the skaters want dialogue, then I hope they are asking for it.

Do the skaters acknowledge that some of their group have behaved badly? Have there been any apologies for such behavior? Any effort to pay for damage done or in any other way address the “wrongs” that have been perpetrated on the neighborhood for the past 10 years? Perhaps, but I am not aware that any of these things have happened. I am hopeful they have, but fear they have not.

So, to recap: a group comes into a neighborhood once a year, and leaves it much worse off than how they found it. Consistently. Ten years of data shows there is little regard or respect of the space or the people who live in that space the other 364 days of the year. There seems to be no clear message that this group is sending – that they want or need something from the community or society. What they show instead is a desire to take what they want for their own fun, no matter what anyone else thinks.

This year, as I watched the police, by mid-afternoon, show their presence, and resolve to not allow the hill bomb to occur this year. As the afternoon and evening unfolded, I had an emotional reaction I have had very little of living in San Francisco for almost 40 years: the feeling that the police were protecting me and my neighborhood from people who do not respect us.

This analysis is done just from my own knowledge and observations. There may be much that I don't know or understand. I would love to learn that the skaters have been more respectful and responsible than what I have presented here. But, until the community is assured that the skaters either have a clear message (one beyond their own joy for a few hours), some contrition over bad behavior by some of their group, or take some responsibility for the wrongs that have been perpetrated for the past 10 years, I hope city leaders and the SFPD continue to shut this event down.

Thank you, SFPD for helping our neighborhood!

Dear Honorable Commissioners:

My family has a proud and long history on Cumberland Street (at Dolores). In the early Seventies my father-in-law purchased a 3 unit building on Cumberland Street and then a couple of years later another 3 unit building a few doors down. My husband was brought home from the hospital to Cumberland Street in 1974 and then we brought our own children to the same home 37 years later. Cumberland Street, a street where children play on the sidewalks and neighbors know each other by name, has been a true community to my family and our tenants for over 50 years.

Hillbomb events have been a part of our community for not as long but an event that started off as a lively skateboarding event for skaters to do their tricks eventually literally went off the rails. The Hillbomb has progressively gotten bigger, more dangerous and more violent; a night that truly terrorizes our neighborhood. Starting in 2020 it also became a night we would not let our children sleep in our home because of how truly terrified the night had become.

In July 2020 the Hillbomb absolutely terrorized our neighborhood and participants in this event not only destroyed personal property but physically attacked two neighbors and sent one to the hospital. It was a night that truly changed our street and made many of us feel unsafe in our homes.

Year after year, we have witnessed the unpermitted Hillbomb take over our neighborhood. It has become an event that has become a free for all for many to do whatever they want without any consequences to their illegal actions. The amount of alcohol and drugs being openly used would ultimately result in some participants staying on Dolores all night partying, illegal fireworks and doing sideshows. The neighborhood would wake up to graffiti, property damage, and even worse with some in the hospital physically injured.

This year, finally the SFPD gratefully got "in front of " the event by blocking the streets early in the day. However, when some of the skaters realized the event was not going to happen and their options of having the event were futile, some skaters got angry and hostile. As this progressed, the SFPD understandably had to shift their presence from peacekeeping to enforcement because some skaters were getting violent.

This year was the first time in many years that the neighborhood woke up and our properties were not covered in graffiti, our sidewalks were not covered in trash/human waste, our streets not covered in tire marks from the sideshows that would take place all night, and most importantly, no skaters or neighbors were physically injured.

Thank you to the SFPD for coming out to do their jobs to enforce laws and keep the neighborhood safe.

I wish to extend my gratitude to the SFPD and the Mission Station of the SFPD for their service on July 8, 2023. I live three blocks away from Dolores Park. The situation in and around the area was getting out of hand, and the SFPD took appropriate actions to protect the community. It must be strongly noted that the SFPD accomplished the goal of subduing the event without any physical violence to persons gathered for the event. The property damage that occurred on the part of those attending the unauthorized event is inexcusable. All too often in San Francisco, unacceptable behavior is tolerated, even when that behavior damages personal and city owned property, and quite frankly impinges on the rights of citizens' seeking a peaceful and civil environment. Consistency of action on the part of the SFPD conducted in a peaceful manner (as on 7/8/23) is what is needed to begin the process of ending the 'doom loop' which we are experiencing in this city.

Police Commissioners and Board of Supervisors:

On behalf of Stop Crime's 4,900 members, I write to urge the commission to support police officers doing their job at the recent Dolores Park riot.

It was hypocritical for commissioners at the last meeting to rush to judgement on the SFPD response to the riot while previously urging the public not to prejudge other events until the facts come, such as the Main Street murder of a tech executive. They should apologize where appropriate.

Here is what we know now:

Two weeks ago, rioters vandalized or damaged dozens of vehicles and endangered MUNI light rail trains with passengers. Some of the participants at the "Hill Bomb" event came to skateboard. Others, including adults, came for violence. They started fights, let off fireworks bombs (M80s), assaulted people, and sprayed graffiti on homes, small businesses and Mission High School.

They came packing – police recovered 2 loaded firearms and 2 other guns, along with 6 knives, and backpacks full of illegal fireworks and graffiti spray paint. At previous Hill Bomb events, they killed someone and paralyzed another. On July 8, they slashed the face of a police officer opening a gate for nearby residents, sending him to the hospital, and spit in the face of others. They threw smoke bombs, fireworks, glass bottles and full cans. You no doubt have seen the YouTube video that shows some of what happens.

SFMTA reportedly estimates \$70,000 in damages with at least 6 transit vehicles out of service for a week. SFMTA Director Steve Hemminger commented at the meeting on the destruction of the social contract in this country following Trump's 2016 election, and Covid-19 has exacerbated the tendency to disorder.

San Francisco government must set reasonable limits on how people use and misuse public property, open space and streets, damage private property, and treat our police officers.

After giving orders to disperse via loudspeakers for over an hour, SFPD arrested 120 people for assault and battery, inciting a riot, violating lawful orders, vandalism and other crimes. No one was arrested for skateboarding. Incredibly, supporters of the rioters are asking the Police Commission to penalize the police for doing their job in a difficult and stressful situation.

Stop Crime Action urges the Commission and the Board of Supervisors to show your support for San Francisco police protecting nearby residents, preventing violence and vandalism.

San Francisco residents want public safety laws obeyed. Otherwise, what will rioters do the next time?
