


California's Data Exchange Framework (DxF)

- Assembly Bill 133 (AB 133) ushered in the California Data Exchange Framework (DxF)
- The vision of DxF "Every Californian, and the health and human service providers and organizations that care for them, will have timely and secure access to usable electronic information that is needed to address their health and social needs and enable the effective and equitable delivery of services to improve their lives and wellbeing."
- DxF is led by the Center for Data Innovation and Insights in the California Health and Human Services Agency
- SFDPH signed the DxF Data Sharing Agreement on 2/21/2023
- AB 133 requires data sharing to begin in 1/2024




Potential Benefits of DxF Participation






BHS Epic Implementation Overview
