DPA Received 39 new cases in the past week.

16%	The officer behaved or spoke inappropriately.
9%	The officer drove improperly.
6%	The complainant raises matters outside the DPA's jurisdiction.
6%	The officer failed to take required action.
6%	The officer displayed threatening, intimidating, or harassing behavior.

Call for service involved larceny, neighbor dispute, noise complaint, motor vehicle theft, trespass, and assault.

District	Current Number of Cases (39) 3 Weeks	Previous Number of Reported Cases 19 (1 week)	Current Report Types
A - Central	7	3	An officer parked a personal vehicle of redlines and failed to curb the front wheels. Officers did not investigate properly and misconstrued the incident as a "Hate Crime" and was taken to hospital for Mental Health.
B - Southern	7	1	Officers failed to provide assistance to a person who sought their help. This person was actively being followed, harassed, and threatened. The officer did not arrest a burglary suspect and did not write an incident report.
C- Bayview	5	2	Officers illegally search a home. They were aggressive and unprofessional while doing so.
D - Mission	6	2	Officers failed to properly investigate a battery and improperly cited an individual. An officer threatened to harm a person and did not activate their body-worn camera during the exchange.
E- Northern	3	2	The officers were verbally aggressive towards the complainant. Officers failed to notify when the owner's vehicle was recovered.

G - Richmond	1	1	An officer-involved shooting occurred involving one officer and a male subject.
H - Ingleside	3	2	The complainant stated that officers failed to take a report and rushed him out of the station
I – Taraval	1	-	The officer behaved inappropriately and issued an inaccurate citation.
J - Tenderloin	3	1	The officer arrested the complainant without cause and treated the complainant unfairly.
Airport	1	-	An officer spoke inappropriately and issued a citation without reason.
Not Applicable		1	The officer made a stop without cause, used excessive force, and foul language towards the complainant. Another officer used unnecessary force against the complainant's partner.
Out of Town	2	-	An officer was removed from the Narcotics Unit at the same time as one of the drug cases the officer was involved in was dropped at court due to potential disciplinary issues. The complainant alleged a failure to protect an informant.
