San Francisco Health Code Article 31 and the Article 31 Regulations set out a process for review of City permits that involve earth disturbing activities on transferred parcels from the former Hunters Point Shipyard (HPS). Article 31 and the Article 31 Regulations are designed to ensure that hazardous materials mitigation measures and environmental restrictions, placed on the property, are implemented. The committee is not being asked to consider changes to the San Francisco Health Code Article 31 at this time and is only being asked to consider amendments to the existing Article 31 Regulations.
