I. CALL TO ORDER DISCUSSION

**Meeting called to order at 5:10pm.** Opening remarks by *Commissioner Dr. Anne Moses.* Ms. Lauren Battung performed roll call, confirmed 5 of 7 Commissioners present (quorum). Mr. Battung read the land acknowledgement.

#### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

### III. DIRECTOR'S REPORT DISCUSSION

Director Kimberly Ellis acknowledged the 33<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act and South Asian Heritage Month. Director Ellis discussed budget highlights. The Department's budget for FY 23-24 and FY 24-25 are \$12,516,542 and \$12,244,087, respectively. The Department was also awarded \$1,250,000 in FY 23-24 and FY24-25 for gender-based violence direct services restoration during the addbacks process.

Director Ellis discussed the Department's efforts to improve grant management operations, including the development of a refined policy and procedures document for narrative and financial reporting as well as measures to expedite the review and processing time for invoices. The Department also

announced the roll out a new grantee reporting system, Envisio, to our grantees at our quarterly grantee meeting in July, planned to be fully implemented during Q1 of FY 23-24.

Directly Ellis shared staffing updates. Alex Boskovich is promoted to Chief of Staff; Lauren Battung is transitioning out of the Department and her Executive Management Assistant role and Cameron Lucas will be promoted to Executive Management Assistant.

# B. COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION REQUIREMENT WAIVER REQUEST FOR BLACK WOMEN REVOLT AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DISCUSSION/possible ACTION

Director Ellis presented a request for a waiver of the competitive solicitation requirement for a grant to Black Women Revolt Against Domestic Violence under Chapter 21G of the Administrative Code.

#### **Commissioner Comment**

Commissioner Zwart asked Director Ellis the Black population in San Fransico and to re-state the rate of domestic violence cases for Black Women in San Franscisco. Director Ellis re-stated that 38% of domestic violence cases are from Black women and the total Black population in San Francisco is roughly 3%.

Commissioner Chung and Rivera echoed the support and need for culturally sensitive organizations to provide services to survivors.
