



To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of California:

Your memorialists beg leave to represent, that by the Third Division of the Ninety-ninth Chapter of the Statutes of this State, entitled "An Act concerning Crimes and Punishments," passed April 16th, 1850, black and mulatto persons are rendered incompetent as witnesses to give evidence against white persons;

That this provision of the Statute in effect denies to all such colored persons, the protection of law in the enjoyment of the rights of property and personal security; and the vicious and unprincipled take advantage of this disability and prey upon those rights with impunity.

In the name of republicanism and humanity, we pray your Honorable body to repeal the aforesaid provision of the Statute, and restore to the colored people the right of protection which that provision withholds from them. And your memorialists, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
