MINUTES JOINT CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEETING FOR LAGUNA HONDA HOSPITAL AND REHABILITATION CENTER August 8, 2023, 4:00 p.m. 101 Grove Street, Room 300 San Francisco, CA 94102 & via Webex

1. CALL TO ORDER

Present: Commissioner Tessie M. Guillermo, Chair

Commissioner Edward A. Chow, MD, Member

Commissioner Laurie Green, Member

Staff Present: Naveena Bobba, MD, and Lucia angel

The meeting was called to order at 4:03pm. Commissioners Guillermo stated that surveyors arrived at LHH the morning of the meeting. LHH leaders and staff were devoted to necessary regulatory work during the time of the meeting. Due this situation, the following items were removed from the agenda: Item 4, "LHH Executive Team Report;" item 5, "Hiring and Vacancy Report;" and item 6, "Regulatory Affairs Report." She also noted that in closed session the Medical Quality Improvement would also be removed. Mr. Morewitz stated that anyone who had planned on making verbal comments regarding the items which were removed, could make those comments during "General Public Comment," item. He added that individuals will still have 3 minutes to make comment during "General Public Comment."

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR MEETING OF July 11, 2023

Public Comment:

Patrick Monette-Shaw made verbal comments and submitted the following summary:

The 7/11/2023 meeting minutes report my concerns about the Moss Adams "Hoshin Kanri" \$10 million contract, which wasn't presented to this LHH-JCC [Agenda Item 3, Public Comment]. The Commission's Finance and Planning Committee approved 4/4/2023 amending a Moss Adams contract, including LHH's \$4,137,632 portion. But \$3.3 million in expenses weren't apportioned to named projects; LHH's portion could be higher. The amendment's "Service Description" said the contract would "[remediate] all Plans of Correction, including [all] RCA's [Root Cause Analysis] reports and Action Plan ["milestones"]. That's

duplicative to HSAG's contract. Why does LHH need two consulting firms to develop documents that were to be prepared by LHH's QIE, HSAG? So, five LHH-JCC meetings later the LHH-JCC hasn't been briefed on this contract at your 4/11/2023, 5/9/2023, 6/13/2023, 711/23, and now 8/8/2023 meetings. There's been no opportunity for members of the public, or members of this JCC, to learn about this contract.

Action Taken: The LHH JCC unanimously approved the July 11, 2023 meeting minutes.

3. **GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Patrick Monette-Shaw made verbal comments and submitted the following summary:

Page 3 of Pickens' "Executive Team Report" changes the planned goal of submitting LHH's recertification application from a generic "in the summer" to now "the end of the summer." Why aren't SFDPH and LHH supplying the LHH-JCC with a more precise date on when the application(s) will be submitted, and why has it slipped to being "the end of the summer"? At the full 8/1/2023 Commission meeting, Pickens claimed the application would be submitted by September 1 before potential resumption of patient evictions on September 19. Under full transparency, this JCC should release publicly the CDPH closure plan with its planned "State-led response team, and State-hired management team installed at LHH" that was to be submitted by July 31. The QIE's "Monthly Monitoring Report #6" dated July 10, 2023 stated, "Root Casuse Analysis" Reports #5 and #6 were submitted to CMS. Those two "RCA" reports should be released immediately!

Teresa Palmer made verbal comments and submitted the following summary:

Regarding Sept 19, 2023 LHH closure and evictions:EVICTION plan mandated by CMS (Federal) was due from the State of Calif. July 31. Where does the state plan to send 500 residents? Where is the closure plan and what is in it? If the hoped for Sept 1 date to apply for recertification is achieved, when will admissions restart? If indeed the application is submitted, will this result in a LIFESAVING delay of the Sept 19 eviction and closure procedures? Is there ANY plan to jettison either SNF care or NF care beds at Laguna Honda?Is there a plan to use LHH beds for non SNF/NF purposes? When will Laguna Honda/SFDPH apply to CDPH/CMS for a waiver of the 120 bed cut (based on ratio of bedrooms to shared bathroom)? These beds are all badly needed by the people of San Francisco, and the architecture is modern and safe.

Carol Bettencourt submitted the following written public comment:

I remain concerned that there may not be sufficient time left for LHH to obtain recertification before the September 19, 2023, deadline for resuming involuntary transfers. I am also concerned that we have been given no information about: the closure plan the State was required to submit in July: or when admissions to LHH might resume: or when LHH will apply for a waiver of the 120 bed cut. These are all critical issues that must be addressed and communicated to concerned San Francisco residents like myself.

7. LAGUNA HONDA HOSPITAL POLICIES

Lucia Angel, LHH Chief of Staff, presented the item.

<u>Public Comment</u>:

Teresa Palmer made verbal comments and submitted the following summary:

We disagree with this policy. We believe that SF Residents who have ended up out of county and SF Residents in non medical facilities, where-ever they are, who need and qualify for care at Laguna Honda should have priority over people who are being safely cared for at our County Hospital (ZSFG). Certainly Laguna Honda residents who have been evicted to out of county medical and nursing facilities should have priority to return.

The right of San Francisco residents to be cared for safely in their own community should not be secondary to the "flow" at San Francisco General Hospital. SFDPH needs to work assertively with other medical and long term care providers to increase long term care capacity in-county so we are not pitting one community in need against another.

Susan Flanders, former nurse and member of the Harkey Milk Democratic Club, stated that the club has taken on LHH as a significant issue because the hospital is a LGBTQ issue, evidenced by the fact that friends, family, and community have received care at LHH. She stated that LHH will likely not give up the ZSFG Flow policy. There has not been appropriate staff training to care for patients with behavioral health and substance use issues. She demands that this training take place. Drug addicted people and patients with mental health issues deserve care with boundaries and proper rights.

Carol Bettencourt submitted the following written public comment:

The LHH JCC will review and consider for recommendation to the Health Commission the LHH policies listed below, including new policies, changes to policies, and removal of policies. These policies will be recommended for approval by the Health Commission on the Consent Calendar. Copies of the proposed policy changes, along with a summary of the changes, will be available on the website for the JCC meeting with this agenda. Existing policies are shown in redline format, highlighting changes, and the recommendation for approval constitutes a recommendation to adopt a clean version that only has the final text and does not include any redlining. Recommendation for Health Commission approval is requested.

Vivian Imperiale, submitted the following written comment:

For years the county has routinely placed San Francisco residents far away in other counties. They are isolated and essentially abandoned with little contact from San Francisco city employees. San Francisco residents deserve far better than being relegated to Priority #4 for admission to LHH. The city had the poor judgment to send them away; the city needs to rectify that by moving them to LHH beds back in their own city where friends and family can visit.

Commissioner Comments:

Commissioner Green noted that some populations have been excluded from the current draft of the Admissions policy, such as those whose primary diagnosis is a psychiatric related issue. Dr. Naveena Bobba, DPH Deputy Director of Health, stated that LHH staff attempted to address comments by the public and Commissioners in their revision of the policy.

Commissioner Chow stated that he understands the current survey interrupted the ability for LHH staff to respond to the LHH JCC member's questions and comments. He stated that he would be comfortable moving forward with a recommendation for approval of the policies if the JCC members' questions and comments were appropriately addressed prior to the Health Commission consideration of approval. He noted that the Commissioners could pull any specific policy off the Consent Calendar for further discussion if any concerns remain before the final approval process.

Commissioner Guillermo stated that she appreciates the revision work on the Admission policy and hopes to revisit it after several months of implementation.

Action Taken: The LHH JCC recommended that the full Health Commission approve the

following, with the understanding that LHH JCC members' questions and comments will be addressed prior to the full Health Commission approval.
