#### Purpose of Agreement:

The goal of the Tenderloin Night Navigator program is to provide trauma-informed mental care, hygiene, and referral services during the nights and weekends, filling an engagement and service gap in the neighborhood. Through providing resources, referrals, de-escalation support, and other on-the-spot and medium-term case management services, the Program adds capacity to community public health care. Code Tenderloin, the designated subcontractor will lead the service delivery.

In June 2022, the Mayor's Office approved \$4.1 million dollars to the Planning Department to begin bringing to life projects and programs which fall under the T-CAP. Of that funding, \$3.5 million is for community development projects and programs that were selected by the Tenderloin community through a participatory budgeting process. The Night Navigator program was among the projects selected for funding through the participatory budgeting

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process in December 2022. SF Planning has requested that DPH provide a funding and oversight mechanism, given that the goals of the program are aligned with DPH's mission to improve public health.

The agency's mission is to transform lives by advancing health, wellness, and equality. Their comprehensive, integrated approach to individual and community health puts their clients at the center of their work. Their wide array of medical, mental health, education, and community services are designed to empower people in safe, respectful, and supportive spaces. The agency is located in San Francisco.

## Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-up:

This Agreement will receive annual monitoring through the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC), including for performance and fiscal stability.

## Health Equity and Inclusion Compliance:

The Vendor will provide the necessary information to comply with the Department's Office of Health Equity (OHE) requirements and will work collaboratively to remove systemic and operational barriers that impede providing appropriate levels of services to meet the needs of disadvantaged BIPOC stakeholders and communities.

## Sole Source:

The Agreement is authorized under the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 21G.8 for Grant Agreements.

In June 2022, the Mayor's Office approved \$4.1 million dollars to the Planning Department to begin bringing to life projects and programs which fall under the T-CAP. Of that funding, \$3.5 million is for community development projects and programs that were selected by the Tenderloin community through a participatory budgeting process. The Night Navigator program was among the projects selected for funding through the participatory budgeting process in December 2022. SF Planning has requested that DPH provide a funding and oversight mechanism, given that the goals of the program are aligned with DPH's mission to improve public health.

To accommodate the Tenderloin Community Action Plan participatory budgeting process results, the Department is requesting approval by the Health Commission of a Chapter 21G.8 Administrative Code sole source waiver, which if approved will enable DPH to contract for the one-time 12-month Tenderloin Night Navigator program to help improve conditions in the Tenderloin.
