A - Central	6		The complainant was assaulted and officers failed to cite and arrest the subject. Officers failed to accept a citizen's arrest.
B - Southern	3		Officers failed to contact the complainant and failed to investigate properly and take required action. An officer also spoke dismissively to the complainant. Officer pointed his firearm at the complainant and took his property.
C- Bayview	6		The officer failed to take required action regarding the complainant's property being released. Officers interviewed the complainant in custody without a lawyer present and ignored the complainant's request to use the bathroom. The officer touched the complainant inappropriately while handcuffing and then slammed the car door on him, hitting his shoulder.
D - Mission	5		The officers kept bothering the complainant at their residence and did not provide their identification when asked. An officer used excessive force and improperly applied handcuffs.

E- Northern	5	The officer displayed rude behavior and lied about the closure time of the park. Officers detained the complainant without cause. The complainant stated that police grabbed her and forced her into an ambulance. An officer was observed drinking in a bar in full uniform. In addition, The San Francisco Police Department is actively shielding the inappropriate actions of one of its members.
F – Park	3	Officers drove improperly. The officer failed to investigate the complainant's report of assault from the other party involved in the motor vehicle accident.
G - Richmond	3	The officers pretended to eat at a restaurant in order to spy on the complainant. Tennant dispute and constantly calling officers on the property owner.
H - Ingleside	3	Officers unlawfully detained, arrested, used excessive force, and failed to mirandize the complainant. The officers inappropriately searched, questioned, and used excessive force on the occupants while serving a court order. The officers damaged the residence.
I – Taraval	3	The officer did not act like he took the complainant's incident seriously and the officer did not request an ambulance for the complainant's injury when requested.
J - Tenderloin	7	Officers failed to respond to call for service. The officer did not act like he took the complainant's incident seriously and the officer did not request an ambulance for the complainant's injury when requested. Officers made an unwarranted arrest and improperly towed two vehicles. Officers failed to investigate a missing persons report. The officer failed to investigate a shooting.
Airport	2	An officer unlawfully used the complainant's FedEx account to mail packages. The complainant was picking up their family member at the terminal and was given a citation without cause.
