Request for approval of a New Grant Agreement with Richmond Area Multi Services Inc to hire and train Peer Counselors to provide low threshold care management to unhoused individuals living in shelters, safe sleep sites, and on the streets of San Francisco, and to also hire, train and fully integrate Peer Counselors into the BEST Neighborhoods street-based behavioral health care teams, in partnership with San Francisco Department of Public Health and community providers providing street-based behavioral health care within San Francisco.

The total proposed agreement amount is \$9,976,421 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of 08/01/2023 through 06/30/2026 (2years and 11 months).

Agreement's Primary Target Groups	Target Population for clients: People who experience homelessness on the streets of San Francisco living with mental health conditions and have had multiple previous engagement with law enforcement or crisis teams, emergency room visits, hospitalizations, have a history of multiple recent substance use overdoses, unsheltered and require follow up support, assessment, wellness checks, medical/psychiatric care, linkage or accompaniment to services.
Agreement's Primary Target Neighborhood or Area	Location of services includes outside/on the streets and in other public spaces of San Francisco, as well in treatment, hospital, shelter, housing, and other indoor settings.

Purpose of Agreement:

Richmond Area Multi Services Inc to hire and train Peer Counselors to provide low threshold care management to unhoused individuals living in shelters, safe sleep sites, and on the streets of San Francisco, and to also hire, train and fully integrate Peer Counselors into the BEST Neighborhoods street-based behavioral health care teams, in partnership with San Francisco Department of Public Health and community providers providing street-based behavioral health care within San Francisco.

RAMS, Inc. is a non-profit mental health organization that is committed to advocating for and providing community-based, culturally competent, and consumer-guided comprehensive services. Founded in San Francisco's Richmond District in 1974, RAMS offers comprehensive services that aim to meet the behavioral health, social, vocational, and educational needs of the diverse community of the San Francisco Area with expertise in serving the Asian & Pacific Islander American and Russian-speaking populations.

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Richmond Area Multi Services Inc was selected under RFGA Sourcing Event 7089. Richmond Area Multi Services Inc was the highest ranked proposer. The RFP allows for an Agreement of up to 10 years which includes contract options which may or may not be exercised.

Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-up:

This Agreement will receive annual monitoring through the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC), including for performance and fiscal stability.

Health Equity and Inclusion Compliance:

The Vendor will provide the necessary information to comply with the Department's Office of Health Equity (OHE) requirements and will work collaboratively to remove systemic and operational barriers that impede providing appropriate levels of services to meet the needs of disadvantaged BIPOC stakeholders and communities.
