A - Central	5	1	The complainant alleges that officers failed to properly investigate. Officers pulled guns, detained, and handcuffed the complainant without cause.
B - Southern	2	-	An officer failed to properly investigate and failed to make a required contact to the owner of a recovered car. The officer used profanity and made a homophobic comment.
C- Bayview	1	2	The complainant alleges that the officers arrested them without cause and lied in their report.
D - Mission	2	3	The complainant stated that the officer did not do anything to help when he reported that he was followed by a man. Officers delayed a response to a 911 call. When the officer did arrive, they failed to write a report.
E- Northern	3	1	Officers failed to properly investigate a sexual assault, to preserve evidence, to activate their body- worn cameras, and to make an arrest. Officers responded to a call for service and instead of asking the complainant to leave they arrested him and placed him in tight handcuffs which caused bruising.

G - Richmond	2	1	The officers failed to file a police report regarding a stolen animal. The officers failed to investigate the burglary of a vehicle as presented by the complainant.
H - Ingleside	1	-	Officers were dismissive and unprofessional when the complainant called the station to ask a question.
I – Taraval	2	1	Unhoused complainant was relieved of their personal property despite protest and threatened by officers if he did not get out of the way.
<mark>J -</mark> Tenderloin	9	2	The officer failed to enforce a court restraining order and made inappropriate comments during a phone call. The complainant was followed and tased by a private security guard while leaving a retail store. The officers failed to properly investigate, arrested the complainant without cause, and used unnecessary and excessive force.
