



Rat Birth Control: A simple next step!


While working on a rodent model of heart disease in menopausal women, infertile rats were the result. Drs. Mayer and Dyer built on observations to real world application: rat birth control!





How fertility control works



Rodents consume attractive bait that stops reproduction in males and females



As they free feed, reproduction is stopped



Active ingredients metabolized within minutes and pose no threat to other species



Bait does not bioaccumulate in soil and water



Product monitored and used in diminishing volumes until expected population reduction is achieved




Case Study: Queen Anne Safeway / **Twenty-One Boston Apartments**

- City requires a "rodent abatement" before demolition
- First poison free demo permit abatement ever!
- Dense urban core with known rodent population
- Achieved 91% reduction of rat population by demolition
- Contractor reported not seeing a single rat in the vacant Safeway prior to demo; leading to happy nearby neighbors












Safeway / TWENTY-ONE BOSTON Challenges


- Bait shyness
- Encampment in bushes, steady flow of litter
- Ample food sources





Approach Based on Peer-Reviewed Methodology Published Study of L.A. Animal Facility Mapping rodent populations

- Early testing site for real-world application of fertility control
- Required strict scientific protocols
- Weekly monitoring
- Demographic tracking of the feeding rats
- Aggressive trap placement, including ceilings
- Field cameras for population demographics and behavioral observation




