

INTRODUCTION TO PLS History of PLS PLS Today

Sheriff Richard Hongisto Hires Raymond Towbis to run a rehabilitation program. Towbis recruits 20 students from New College's University Year for Action program to provide services to San Francisco's incarcerated population. Among them is Michael Marcum, an ex-offender who would go on to be Assistant Sheriff.



Sheriff Vikki Henessy adopts first-ever official PLS Policy



Raymond Towbis hires Vista lawyer Michael Hennessey to provide legal information and assistance to incarcerated population. Hennessey forms "San Francisco County Jail Prisoner Legal Assistance" and recruits law students to help from New College School of Law.

Michael Hennessey wins election for Sheriff, secures budgeted attorney position and funding to establish "Prisoner Legal Services." Hires Stephen Greenberg as first PLS Directing Attorney.





- Our program is a model for other jurisdictions across the state and nation.
