Inacted Into Law in 2005





Funded by a 1% income tax on income < \$1M



Designed to transform mental health systems and address unmet needs



Based on a set of core principles

The Problem Facing Black Moms

More likely to suffer from perinatal mood disorders

Black people were 1.4x more likely to have a post-partum mental health condition compared to other racial groups

Less likely to receive treatment

Black people were less than half as likely to get mental health treatment or initiate medication


