1. Call to Order and Introductions (discussion only)

Carolyn Gossin from the Public Defender’s Office called the meeting to order. She thanked Council members and members of the interested public for attending the meeting. She acknowledged the other five Co-Chairs:

Victoria Westbrook completed Reentry Council Roll Call and indicated that there was quorum.

2. Raymatush Ohlone Land Acknowledgment

The Chair read the Raymatush Ohlone Land Acknowledgement.

3. Welcome two New Mayoral Appointees and the New BOS Appointed Pretrial Diversion Services Seat Representative (discussion only).

Carolyn Gossin welcomed back Antonio Napoleon and Allen Harven who were reappointed by the Mayor. She also welcomed new member Tatiana Lewis, appointed by the Mayor to the seat occupied by someone who entered the justice system before age 24 years and is currently between 18 & 35 years old. She also welcomed David Mauroff, representing the SF Pretrial Diversion Project, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

6. Staff Report on Activities of the Reentry Council (discussion only).

Victoria Westbrook, Reentry Policy Planner for the San Francisco Adult Probation Department, provided the following updates:

- The Annual Retreat is scheduled for January 22, 2024 at the San Francisco Main Library.
- **Women 1st Subcommittee:** The subcommittee to meet at the women’s Resource Center on December 13, 2024 at 12 pm.
- **Legislation, Policy, & Practices Subcommittee:** Formed a Protected Class Initiative working group to continue working on the initiative. Next meeting is scheduled Feb. 2024
- **Direct Action Subcommittee:** Richard Beal reported an End of the Year celebration is scheduled for December 6, 2023. He’s asking for community support and funding to support this event.
Recovery Summit is scheduled for March 2024
Recovery Symposium is scheduled for May 2024

7. Regular Update on Activities of the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, Sentencing Commission, Collaborative Courts, Community Corrections Partnerships, and STARR (discussion only).

8. Racial Equity Work Updates (discussion & possible action).

Alea Brown-Hoffmeister provided report for Racial Equity for The Adult Probation Department. She introduced the ORE – Be the Change Online Course Justice Cohort

Carolyn Gossen provided an Update for PDR National Equity

9. Public Defender’s Office Freedom Project (discussion & possible action).

Managing Attorney Danielle Harris, together with her team – Stephen Liebb, Amanda Perez, Elliot Hosman and Rachel Stober introduced the Freedom Project. The Freedom Project is dedicated to decarceration, successful transition to the freer world, and post-conviction systemic change. In four years, the Project has helped shorten 93 prison sentences--reuniting 80 people with their families and communities including 42 people who were serving life sentences--and improved laws allowing second-look resentencing

10. College Pathways Project (discussion only).

Executive Director Jason Bell and George Turner introduced the newest initiative to San Francisco State’s Project Rebound program. The College Pathway Project. Through this initiative, the SF Public Defender’s Office has formalized partnerships with San Francisco State’s Project Rebound program, and with City College of San Francisco’s New Directions program. Partnerships with these programs will make it easier for current and former Public Defender clients to apply for, attend, and succeed in college. All of our clients are eligible – whether they face a felony or misdemeanor or youth charge, are in a collaborative or mental health court or whether they use clean slate post-conviction services.

Project Rebound supported City College in applying for and receiving state funding to enable them to hire a full-time person to run their New Directions Program. We are asking for referrals from the Reentry Council for folks who have been impacted by the criminal legal system who are interested in community college, there will be more robust services available to them through the New Directions Program starting in 2024. The Public Defender’s Office will now have a designated space for Project Rebound to liaise with attorneys and social workers in our office, and Project Rebound staffers will attend court hearings and advocate on behalf of client participants for improved legal outcomes when possible and appropriate.

Melanie Kim, the Public Defender Office's State policy director, shared a roundup of bills that made it – or were killed – through the legislative process, that are of relevance to this committee.

12. Discussion Regarding Supervised Clients, aged 18-24 –Adult & Juvenile Probation (discussion only).

Adela Martinez, Specialized Services Division Director and Supervising Probation Officer Daniel Reyes from Adult Probation and Asst. Chief Gabe Calvillo, Juvenile Probation presented data and services for juvenile, TAYA and TAY clients.

Adult Probation TAY Services (aged 18-24): Probation Supervised TAY Unit, Domestic Violence TAY Caseload, TAY Court Collaboration with SFPD, SF Courts, Public Defender and District Attorney's Offices, case managers for wellness planning, and Successful Completion incentives.

Juvenile Probation Services: Data presented for AB12 Caseload Demographics: API 8%, Latinx 19%, and 69% Black. 28% female and 72% male. 24% SF residents and 76% outside of SF
