The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the November 2023 Monthly Data Report:

PS Chart 1: Probation Referrals, CARC Intakes, and MIR Referrals (slide 22)

■ There were 61 referrals in November, 29% lower than the 2023 year-to-date average.

JH Chart 1.1: Admissions & Releases (slide 6)

- There were 26 admissions in November, 16% lower than the 2023 year-to-date average.
- There were 40 releases in November, outpacing the number of admissions.

JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population (slide 7)

- The average daily population decreased in November to 28 young people.
- The peak population in November was 35 young people.

JH Chart 2.2: ADP by Race/Ethnicity (slide 10)

- The average daily population in November was 100% youth of color.
- Since August, Latinx youth have accounted for the largest percentage of youth in Juvenile Hall, followed by Black youth.

PS Chart 5.1: Warrants by Type (slide 39)

• There were 58 youth with active warrants, 49% higher than the 2023 year-to-date average.
