Public Comment

Public Comment will be taken in-person, either before or during the Committee's consideration of each agenda item. Speakers may address the Committee for up to three minutes. During General Public Comment, members of the public may address the Committee on matters that are within the Committee's jurisdiction and are not on today's agenda. People who have received an accommodation due to a disability (as described below) may provide their public comments remotely.

In addition to public comment as described above, the Committee will set aside up to 20 minutes for each item for members of the public who wish to appear remotely, taking calls in the order that users add themselves to the queue. Because of the twenty (20) minute time limit, it is possible that not every person in the queue will have an opportunity to participate in the meeting remotely.
