The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the December 2023 Monthly Data Report:

# PS Chart 1: Probation Referrals, CARC Intakes, and MIR Referrals (slide 22)

 There were 66 referrals in December, 27% lower than the 2023 average of 84 referrals per month.

# JH Chart 1.1: Admissions & Releases (slide 6)

 There were 19 admissions in December, 37% lower than the 2023 average of 30 admissions per month.

#### JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population (slide 7)

- The average daily population in December was 26 young people, the same as the 2023 average.
- The peak population in December was 31 young people.

# JH Chart 2.2: ADP by Race/Ethnicity (slide 10)

• The average daily population in December was 100% youth of color.

# JH Chart 3.2: Average Length of Stay for Youth Released (slide 15)

• The average length of stay for youth released in December was 7 days, longer than the 2023 average of 6 days.

# PS Chart 5.1: Active Warrants by Type (slide 38)

- There were 60 active warrants as of 12/31/23, and 47 youth with active warrants.
  - Note: 2023 calculations have been revised to account for a data QA issue. The number of active warrants and youth with active warrants is lower than previously reported.
