6%	Neglect of Duty	The officer failed to promptly respond to a scene.



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6%	Unwarranted Action	The officer made an arrest without cause.

A - Central	2	2	The officer cited the suspect instead of a physical arrest.
B - Southern	3	1	The officers used excessive force. Officers failed to timely respond to the complainant's report of an assault resulting in a subsequent assault.
C- Bayview	-	-	
D - Mission	2	-	An officer conducted a vehicle traffic stop, towed the vehicle, and placed a hold on it without cause. The officer behaved rudely, failed to provide their name and star number when requested, and did not call a supervisor
E- Northern	4	1	The complainant stated that officers refused to move a police vehicle blocking a driveway, refused to take a police report and refused to provide a badge number when requested. An officer ran a bicyclist off the road and drove his vehicle at an excessive rate of speed.
F – Park	1	-	The complainant had not been treated for his head injury; however, the officer/s had him illegally discharged from the emergency department.
G - Richmond	3	-	The complainant stated an officer made a false report and only believed the other parties involved. The complainant stated she was wrongly arrested.
H - Ingleside	2	-	The officers failed to cite the person for intoxication and move the person's car. An officer arrested the complainant without cause.
I – Taraval	3	2	The officer failed to promptly respond. The officer falsely imprisoned the complainant at the hospital.
J - Tenderloin	4	2	The officer cited the complainant for no reason, refused to call a supervisor to the scene, and threatened the complainant to jail.
