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Subject: Slides to highlight from the January 2024 Monthly Data Report, prepared for the 3/13/24 Juvenile Probation Commission meeting

The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the January 2024 Monthly Data Report:

JH Chart 1.1: Admissions & Releases (slide 6)

- There were 28 admissions in January, 82% of which were mandatory.

JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population (slide 7)

- The average daily population in January was 28 young people.
- The peak population has continued to decrease to 30 young people in January.

JH Chart 2.2: ADP by Details (slides 10 & 12)

- The average daily population in January was 100% youth of color. Black youth account for the largest percentage of youth in Juvenile Hall, followed by Latinx youth – a reversal from most of the latter half of 2023.
- The average daily population in January was 25% committed youth.

JH Chart 3.2: Average Length of Stay for Youth Released (slide 15)

- The average length of stay for youth released in January increased to 11 days.

PS Chart 1: Referrals to Probation & Diversion Referrals (slides 22 -23)

- There were 66 referrals to Probation in January, and 12 were either counseled/referred and closed or diverted.
 - Note: This slide has been updated to measure diversion referrals rather than intakes. A Diversion Glossary is included on slide 23.
