



Who We Defend

Our Community's Most Vulnerable and Disenfranchised





In The Courts

In 2023, our defense teams took 60 felony cases to trial.

- 40% resulted in acquittals and hung juries
- 33% resulted in mixed verdicts

Our attorneys also fought for and secured 2715 dismissals in felony and misdemeanor cases.

In addition to advocating for justice for our clients in the courtroom, we also:

- Connect clients to mental health, substance use, and other support services.
- Provide support and advocacy for clients in diversion programs.
- Support youth and their families with matters in the Juvenile Court System.
- Represent immigrants in removal proceedings to keep immigrant families together.
- Track misconduct and hold law enforcement accountable.





In The Courts

















Advancing Community Safety & Empowerment

In addition to fiercely defending low-income youth and adults in the courtroom, we advance community safety and empower communities through:

- Magic Programs empower youth and families in the Bayview and Western Addition/Filmore through summer literacy programs, backpack giveaways, holiday events, and regular community convenor meetings.
- Legal Education Advocacy Program (LEAP) advocates for marginalized youth to get their educational and safety needs met by visiting and advocating for youth in SFUSD schools every week.









Advancing Community Safety & Empowerment

- **End the Cycle Program** reduces recidivism through social workers connecting community members with services upon their first contact with the system.
- Clean Slate Program ensures second chances by assisting community members with obtaining expungements through daily walk-ins and monthly community clinics across the city.
- College Pathway Project connects our clients with opportunities to obtain a higher education at SF State and City College.



Challenges: Growing Workloads & Caseloads

Average Caseloads for Attorneys



Causes:

- Trial Delays
- 2. Increase in DA filings
- Decrease in DA referrals to diversion programs and specialty courts
- Increased workloads due to changes in state law (e.g., Racial Justice Act and Mental Health Diversion) and body worn camera, video surveillance footage, and cell phone technology


