HOW TO JOIN

Because of the 10-minute time limit, it is possible that not every person in the queue will have an opportunity to provide remote public comment. Remote public comment from people who have received an accommodation due to disability (as described below in the "Accessible Meeting Policy") will not count toward the 10-minute limit.
