PREVENTION & COMMUNITY EDUCATION

- Receive complaints from survivors concerning the ways city agencies have responded or failed to respond to incidents of sexual assault.
- Advocate for survivors navigating city agencies to resolve the complaints regarding the mishandling of sexual assault allegations.

- Build survivor-led community coalitions to recommend new meaningful policies that provide support and resources for survivors of sexual harassment and assault within and without the criminal legal system.
- Work with existing city response systems to address sexual harassment and assault incidents with dignity, safety and professionalism.

 Collaborate with community partners to engage in public education and culture shifting towards a San Francisco without sexual violence.

FREE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR SURVIVORS

- Provide 52 free sessions to Survivors of Sexual
 Violence (based off the 52 Batterer Intervention
 Program which has a court order of 52 weeks)
- Key point is that sessions will be provided without a police report or criminal case.
- Collaboration with a local mental health agency with MFT/MSW interns.
- Limited funding for pilot program through DOSW




Policy Ideas

PROJECT SURVIVE EXPANSION

- During her State of the City on International Women's Day, Mayor London Breed named that "Violence Against Women Prevention & Intervention to provide <u>funding</u> for core services to end gender-based violence in San Francisco.
- Project Survive Provides education prevention through peer educators at various High Schools, providing more funding would allow them to expand to more high schools.
