Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital, founded in 1989, is a veterinary hospital dedicated to the care of avian and exotic pets. The business provides dedicated care for a variety of underserved pet animal species. This includes birds, rabbits, rodents, and reptiles.

Exotic pets have special needs. When your bird, reptile, or small mammal develops a problem, it's important to be seen quickly by an experienced veterinarian. Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital treats thousands of avian and exotic patients each year. By limiting their practice to these species, they have accumulated in-depth knowledge and experience that translates into expert treatment for your pet. Most of their patients are prey species by nature who are frightened by the sounds and smells of predators. Because Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital does not treat dogs and cats, they are able to provide the low stress environment necessary for healing and recovery.

Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital serves both locals and those that travel from outside the San Francisco Bay Area. The business received a Best in the Bay award in the 2000s from San Francisco Bay Guardian.

- The property in which the business is located was identified as a contributor to an identified cluster in the 2015 Unadopted Neighborhood Commercial Corridors Survey. The subject property is currently in an active SF Survey area, and this finding will be verified.
- With regard to racial and social equity, Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital is a woman-owned business. Women owned businesses in San Francisco hold significant importance in fostering economic diversity and empowerment. Such enterprises contribute to breaking traditional gender barriers in the business world promoting female leadership and entrepreneurship. Additionally, women owned businesses play a pivotal role in addressing gender pay gaps and providing opportunities for women in the workplace. These businesses contribute to the city's cultural vibrancy by bringing diverse perspectives and innovative ideas. Supporting women owned businesses in San Francisco aligns with the broader goal of creating a more inclusive and equitable business environment fostering social progress and sustainable economic growth.

Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital supports Animal Care and Control (ACC) by participating in their free first appointment program. It has also provided support to their head veterinarian as ACC expanded their ability to treat and care for exotic species. Additionally, the business supports the local bird rescue group Mickaboo Companion Bird Rescue via free exam and discounted services to enable the care for more abandoned and rescued birds. Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital has also provided health care for the Telegraph Hill conures, primarily emergency care through Mickaboo.

Bay Area Bird Hospital, DBA Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital, was founded by Dr. Lynn Dustin on July 10, 1989, at 2055 Taraval Street in the Parkside area of the Outer Sunset.

When the practice outgrew its location in 1996, Dr. Dustin moved the hospital less than a block away to a larger location at 2145 Taraval Street.

Dr. Dustin brought Dr. Leila Marcucci into practice ownership in 2009. They worked together as business partners until 2014 when Dr. Marcucci purchased the remaining shares and became the sole owner of the business.

Dr. Dustin continued to work at Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital as a veterinarian until health issues forced her to reduce her hours. She continues at the practice as a consulting employee.

b. Provide the ownership history of the business in a consolidated year-to-year format.

1989 to 2009: Dr. Lynn Dustin

2009 to 2014: Dr. Lynn Dustin; Dr. Leila Marcucci

2014 to Present: Dr. Leila Marcucci

c. Describe any circumstances that required the business to cease operations in San Francisco for any significant length of time.

The business has never been shut down for any length of time. During the COVID pandemic, the practice remained open to serve the needs of its patients and their owners.

CRITERION 2: The business has contributed to the neighborhood's history and/or the identity of a particular neighborhood or community

a. Describe the business' contribution to the history and/or identity of the neighborhood, community, business sector, or San Francisco as a whole.

Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital is the only veterinary practice in the city of San Francisco that is devoted solely to the care of avian and exotic pets. Their experienced staff and specialized equipment enable them to handle a wide range of medical and surgical conditions. In the past few decades, the number of veterinarians in San Francisco willing and/or able to see these pets has dwindled to only a few. Dr. Marcucci and Dr. Dustin are the only board-certified Avian Specialists (Diplomates of the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners) in all of San Francisco, San Mateo, and Marin counties.

A short list of species Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital treats include the following:

- Birds of all types, including canaries, finches, budgies, parakeets, lovebirds, cockatiels, conures, parrots, cockatoos, macaws, doves, pigeons, songbirds, waterfowl, and backyard poultry
- Reptiles, including turtles, tortoises, lizards, and non-venomous snakes
- Rabbits
- Guinea pigs
- Chinchillas
- Hamsters
- Ferrets
- Rats and mice
- Hedgehogs

Birds and exotic pets benefit from regular veterinary care. A wellness check-up by Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital allows them to establish a baseline by performing a physical exam, assessing body weight, and screening for underlying problems.

Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital also discusses nutritious diets, healthy lifestyles, and ways to enrich your pet's environment. They will teach you everything you need to know in order to safely handle, medicate, or treat your pet.

Additionally, the business supports the local bird rescue group Mickaboo Companion Bird Rescue via free exam and discounted services to enable the care for more abandoned and rescued birds. Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital has also provided health care for the Telegraph Hill conures, primarily emergency care through Mickaboo.

d. Has the business ever been referenced in the media, business trade publication, and/or historical documents?

The business has not been referenced in the media, business trade publications, and/or historical documents.

e. Has the business ever received any awards, recognition, or political commendations?

Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital received a Best in the Bay award in the 2000s from San Francisco Bay Guardian.

f. How would the community be diminished if the business were to be sold, relocated, shut down, etc.?

If Bay Area Bird Hospital were to close, the city would lose its only exotic-specific veterinary hospital and the only board-certified avian specialist for several counties. Clients would be forced to find veterinarians who are willing and able to take new avian/exotic patients, likely outside the city of San Francisco. The nearest bird-only veterinary hospitals are located in Oakley and San Jose. The nearest exotics-specific veterinary hospital is in Santa Cruz. In addition, six employees would be out of work.

Following the founder's footsteps, Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital will stay open in the long term by attracting another associate veterinarian and selling to that individual. The business has no desire to sell to a corporate consolidator or become part of a large multi-hospital, multi-state business.

d. What challenges is the business facing today?

Challenges include the costs of owning and running a small business in an expensive city – rent, taxes, and providing an appropriate and supportive environment for employees. San Francisco is especially difficult when it comes to permits – trying to navigate the complex permitting system, affording the permits, and the time it takes to get permits. The speedy review for permits meeting specific guidelines is a great start to helping out the (truly) small business owner.



The subject property was identified as a contributor to an identified cluster in the 2015 Unadopted Neighborhood Commercial Corridors Survey. The subject property is currently in an active SF Survey area and this finding will be verified.

Staff Analysis

Review Criteria

1. When was business founded?

The business was founded in 1989.

2. Does the business qualify for listing on the Legacy Business Registry? If so, how?

Yes. Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital qualifies for listing on the Legacy Business Registry because it meets all of the eligibility Criteria:

- a. Bay Area Bird & Exotics Hospital has operated continuously in San Francisco for 35 years.
