In April of 2023, the Police Commission voted unanimously in favor of DGO 9.07, a comprehensive policy to prohibit racially-biased traffic stops in San Francisco. Nearly a year later, with the meet and confer process over, it is time for you to unanimously approve and implement the policy.

This DGO process has been refreshingly open to the public. There were 11 public meetings, listening sessions, and presentations held at various locations throughout the city. The Commission's website has a dedicated link placed prominently on the homepage that contains each draft of the policy, notes from the Human Rights Committee's listening sessions, relevant traffic stop data, comparable policies from other jurisdictions, reports from the Center for Policing Equity, and recommended changes from various interested parties.

This transparency must continue as the Commission and the Department transition to implementing this vital policy. The policy's reporting requirements should result in as much open discussion and sharing of information as the policy's creation.

As a Criminologist with a PhD from Pennsylvania State University and a law student at Golden Gate University, I understand and emphasize the need for this vital policy to go into effect immediately based on the will of the people and public safety concerns.

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Secretary Stacy Youngblood,

Dear President Elias and Commissioners,

In January of 2023, the Police Commission voted in favor of DGO 9.07, a comprehensive policy to prohibit racially-biased traffic stops in San Francisco. Over one year later, the policy is still in meet and confer. Nothing justifies this extensive delay.

Racial disparities have not changed in traffic stops and it is time for creative policy solutions that do not reinforce the status quo. The nation and the state sadly mirror San Francisco in over-policing communities of color via pretextual stops. There has been absolutely no progress. Since 2018, SFPD has stopped Black people at least six times the rate of white people, searched Black people at least 10 times the rate of white people, and were at least 12 times more likely to use force on Black people than white people.

Each time the Police Commission meets and refuses to bring the policy back for final approval, it directly perpetuates this harm against communities of color. Meet and confer has been going on for far too long to justify, with plenty of time to reach agreement and move forward. At the next Police Commission meeting, you should bring DGO 9.07 back for a final vote and implementation.
